

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven April 22/1842

Friday April the 22 1842

first part wind from S headed ESE
rain squalls at 6 broke the King's of Agastonia the
Capt came on board Middle part variable headed E
latter part wind from SE headed ENE ship off the
lee quarter so ends
Lat 42° 2' 30" S
Long 101° 34' W

Saturday April the 23 1842

first part light breeze from NE
headed ENE sail in sight Middle part light rain
and variable latter part strong breeze from
SE headed ENE so ends
Lat 42° 2' 30" S
Long 89° 39' W

Sunday April the 24 1842

first part squally from SE headed
ENE Middle part at 9 am shifted to ENE headed
SE rain and strong breeze latter part the same
so ends
Lat 42° 9' 00" S

Monday April the 25 1842

first part strong breeze from NE
headed SE Middle part wind from ENE headed
SE latter part wind from E headed SE so ends
the fore spencer and employed making a main
one of it so ends
Lat 42° 11' 15" S
Long 89° 3' 30" W

Tuesday April the 26 1842

first part wind from SE and
light rain squalls headed ENE employed upon
the spencer Middle part strong breeze headed ENE
latter part wind ESE headed NE watch employ
ed in ships duty so ends
Lat 42° 11' 15" S
Long 88° 58' W

Wednesday April the 27 1842

first part strong breeze from
ENE headed NE watch employed in ships
duty Middle part strong breeze latter part the same
so ends
Lat 42° 11' 15" S
Long 87° 38' W

Thursday April the 28 1842 first part strong breeze from
ENE headed NE watch employed in ships duty saw
blackfish Middle part ten to NE of NE with 12 then backed and
headed SE latter part the same so ends
Lat 42° 3' 19" S

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven May 1 1842

Friday April the 29 1842

first part strong breeze from ENE headed SE
started water Middle part headed SE at daylight backed ship
latter part strong breeze from ENE headed NE so ends
Lat 42° 3' 40" S

Saturday April the 30 1842

first part strong breeze from E headed ENE
at 10 backed Middle part strong breeze from ESE headed SE
latter part the same so ends
Lat 42° 4' 50" S

Sunday May the 1 1842

first part strong breeze from ESE
headed SE watch employed in ships duty Middle part
the same latter part the same so ends
Lat 42° 6' 00" S
Long 87° 58' W

Monday May the 2 1842

first part strong breeze from ESE headed
SE at sunset backed ship saw blackfish and pinkish Middle
part headed NE of E latter part at daylight backed headed SE
saw a fitting new foretopmast rigging so ends
Lat 42° 6' 30" S
Long 87° 14' W

Tuesday May the 3 1842

first part strong breeze from SE of E headed
NE of E employed fitting foretopmast rigging saw a great
many blackfish Middle part headed ENE latter part the
same so ends
Lat 42° 5' 50" S
Long 87° 44' W

Wednesday May the 4 1842

first part strong breeze from
NE of E headed NE of E watch employed in ships duty
saw pinkfish and blackfish saw a sail Middle part
at 10 backed and headed SE latter part wind from E headed
NE so ends
Lat 42° 6' 30" S
Long 87° 12' W

Thursday May the 5 1842

first part light breeze from E headed NE
until 12 backed and headed SE of E Middle part same
SE latter part wind from ESE at 10 backed headed NE so ends
Lat 42° 6' 50" S

Friday May the 6 1842 first part light breeze from NE
headed NE of E fitting a new boat saw a sail Middle part
light breeze and variable latter part the same got
2 small blackfish so ends
Lat 42° 6' 50" S
Long 87° 2' W
