

Remarks On board Ship *Martha Fairhaven* May 20 1842

Friday May the 20 1842

first part wind from NW by W at 10 am
came off with some potatoes and 6 men that shipped
10 or 8 more barrels of blackfish oil at 10 am part 2 got
single weight all hands employed stowing anchors under in
chains & heating out of the bay Middle part the same
latter part no hand in sight wind from NW by W at 10 am
Lat 43° 31' N Long 71° 15' W

Saturday May the 21 1842

first part wind strong from
NW by W Middle part strong breeze from
NW by W latter part the same steered NW by W saw
nothing so ends Lat 43° 20' N Long 71° 15' W

Sunday May the 22 1842

first part wind from N headed
W by W watch employed in ship Duty Middle part
strong breeze from NE steered NW by W latter part the
same so ends Lat 43° 21' N Long 71° 10' W

Monday May the 23 1842

first part wind from NE
steered NW by W Middle part steered NW by W latter
part the same strong saw blackfish watch
employed in ship Duty ends Lat 43° 11' N Long 71° 12' W

Tuesday May the 24 1842

first part wind from
SE steered NW by W made out the landward
side of the after hall and coopered head
in Middle part steered NW by W latter part steered
NW by W watch employed heaving out the after hall
and coopering head ends Lat 43° 15' N Long 71° 25' W

Wednesday May the 25 1842

first part light breeze from E by E steered
NW by W at 3 lowered fore blackfish and got 3 Middle
part light air from NE steered NW by W latter part light air
from N headed NW by W saw blackfish and coopered
latter part light air from NE steered NW by W latter part light
air and coopering the stern and making a new
choyol yard so ends Lat 43° 15' N Long 70° 5' W

Remarks On board Ship *Martha Fairhaven* May 26 1842

Thursday May the 26 1842

first part light breeze from NE steered
NW at 3 finished hoisting Middle part light air laying aback
latter part calm took in the bow boat employed repairing
up her 50 ends Lat 43° 15' N Long 71° 15' W

Friday May the 27 1842

first part light breeze from E by E
heaved NE repairing boat Middle part light air steered NW
latter part the same foggy scene Lat 43° 15' N Long 71° 15' W

Saturday May the 28 1842

first part light air from E by E and
foggy because of E watch employed in ship Duty
Middle part light breeze and calm latter wind from
E by E heaved NW by W saw South Head of Albemarle
run in fore it so ends Lat 43° 15' N

Sunday May the 29 1842

first part strong breeze from E by E
steered NW by W saw 2 sails at sunset they had their boats
down Middle part calm latter part light air and calm
saw two sails so ends Lat 43°

Monday May the 30 1842

first part strong breeze from E by E
steered NW by W spoke the ~~Robert Edwards~~ and William &
Henry ~~heads~~ and gained Middle part light air and calm
latter part the same 8 sails in sight at 11 spoke the
Welline fish of Fairhaven so ends Lat 43° 15' N

Tuesday May the 31 1842

first part strong breeze from E by E
steered NW by W along shore at 5 Capt went on board the
Robert Edwards Middle part light air and calm latter
part the same go back night and fore noon by the current
as much as we gain afternoons ends Lat 43° 15' N

Wednesday May the 1 1843
first part part wind from NE steered
NW at 4 got voyal broke the main voyal yard and sent it
down Middle part light breeze steered NW by W latter part light
air and calm painting the stern and making a new
choyol yard so ends Northwesterly bearing E
