

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven June 17 1842
Friday June the 17 1842

first part wind from E steered NW
watch employed on ship duty Middle part strong breeze
under easy sail latter part the same saw four birds and a
sail so ends
Lat 41° 5' S
Long 105° 10' W

Saturday June the 18 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E spoke the Navigator of Van Hook she
sent her boat on board for letters stood to the S
upon saw four birds Middle part the same kept
the topsail latter part the same at 6 upon ship
and headed NE of E sail in sight so ends Lat 41° 33' S
Long 105° 40' W

Sunday June the 19 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E headed NE ship off the weather bow at
6 upon ship and took in the foretop sail Middle
part strong gale headed N latter part strong gale
at 1 upon ship headed NE Middle part same sail
saw 3 ships so ends
Lat 41° 24' S

Monday June the 20 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E headed NE 3 ships in sight at 6 upon ship
and shortened sail Middle part the same headed
NE of E latter part the same saw a sail watch employed
in ship duty so ends
Lat 41° 44' S

Tuesday June the 21 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E headed NE saw a sail watch employed
in ship duty Middle part the same latter part
steered NW of N saw one sail watch employed heading
out head in the fore hold and coopersing it so ends
Lat 41° 9' S

Wednesday June the 22 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E coopersing head steered NW of N latter part strong
aback headed to the northward latter part strong NW water
employed coopersing head so ends
Lat 41° 4' S
Long 108° 30' W

Thursday June the 23 1842

first part wind from E steered NW of N
finished coopersing head Middle part headed to the southward
latter part steered NW of N unbent the maintop sail and
went another so ends
Lat 41° 48' S

Friday June the 24 1842
first part wind from E of E steered NW
saw a sail watch employed hunting the main
top sail Middle part layed aback headed S latter part
steered NW of N watch employed upon the maintop sail
so ends
Lat 41° 29' S

Saturday June the 25 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E steered NW of N saw four birds watch employed
upon the topsail Middle part the same latter part
steered NW of N watch employed upon the topsail so
ends
Lat 41° 35' S
Long 112° 28' W

Sunday June the 26 1842
first part strong breeze from
E of E steered NW of N watch employed upon the
topsail Middle part the same steered NW of N latter
part the same so ends
Lat 41° 32' S

Monday June the 27 1842
first part wind from E
steered NW of E Middle part the same latter part
the same watch employed repairing mainsail
so ends
Lat 41° 30' S
Long 114° 40' W

Tuesday June the 28 1842
first part wind from E of E steered
NW of N saw four birds and blackbird mending mainsail Middle
part steered NW of N latter part the same mended
the fore sail so ends
Lat 41° 00' S
Long 116° 00' W

Wednesday June the 29 1842
first part wind from
E of E steered NW of N spoke the east mouth of N Bedford
Middle part the same latter part wind from E of E saw
a sail so ends
Lat 41° 28' S
Long 116° 15' W
