

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven July 28 1842

Wednesday July the 28 1842

first part wind from E by S heavy S
saw breeches of 5 finished boiling Middle part headed S
latter part light breeze from N by E heard N by W at sundown
latter so ends

Lat 46° 1' 42" N
Long 131° 48' W

Thursday July the 29 1842

first part wind from N by E and light
squalls headed S by E, latter wind from E by E headed
N by E Middle part headed N by E latter part the same
strong breezes so ends

Lat 46° 4' 4" N
Long 131° 50' W

Friday July the 30 1842

first part strong breeze from E by E
employed coopers oil and breaking out oil from
between decks Middle part the same latter part
all hands employed breaking out the foreboard side
of the main Hatch and stowing down oil
so ends

Lat 46° 00' 22" N

Saturday July the 31 1842

first part wind from E by E
headed N by E all hands employed stowing oil
Middle part headed S latter part headed N by E until
I went down headed S by S finished stowing down
120 bbls and got washed off so ends

Sunday July the 31 1842

first part good weather wind
from E headed N by E same purposes Middle part
headed the same latter part lighter N by E good
weather so ends

Monday August the 1 1842

first part light breeze from E by S
headed N by N Middle part the same latter part
same so ends

Lat 46° 00' 50" N

Long 131° 55' W

Tuesday August the 2 1842

first part light breeze from N by E
headed N by E saw blackbird and bent another ship Middle
part saw a ship boiling at 12 fathoms latter part
at 8 spoke the Hercules of New Bedford heard
N by E so ends

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven August 3 1842

Wednesday August the 3 1842

first part wind from E by E headed
N by E watch employed in ships duty Middle part the
same latter part strong breeze headed N by E watch empls
- yet breaking out and coopers meat in same north
- by so ends

Lat 46° 00' 51" N
Long 131° 19' W

Thursday August the 4 1842

first part strong breeze from
N by E coopers meat headed N by E at sundown
headed Middle part headed N by E latter part fine
weather no whales seen

Lat 46° 08' 1" N

Friday August the 5 1842

first part light breeze from
E by E headed S watch employed in ships duty Middle
- the part steered S by N latter part headed S saw a
great many porpoises so ends

Lat 46° 1' 14" N
Long 131° 45' W

Saturday August the 6 1842

first part wind from S by E and
fine weather steered S by E watch employed in ships
duty Middle part steered the same latter part the
same saw porpoises so ends

Lat 46° 12' 55" N
Long 131° 00' 4" W

Sunday August the 7 1842

first part strong breeze steered S
watch employed in ships duty Middle part strong breeze
steered S by E latter part the same so ends

Lat 46° 5' 25" N
Long 131° 40' W

Monday August the 8 1842

first part strong breeze from E by S
steered S by E part of Mizen topgallant broken Middle part
more than crate latter part steered S wind light watch em
ployed in ships duty so ends

Lat 46° 8' 5" N
Long 131° 54' W

Tuesday August the 9 1842

first part light breeze from N by E steered
S by N Middle part steered the same latter part set the
foretopmast steering and wind from E so ends
