Saturday Sept. the 3 1842

Saw blackish at 5 saw breaches ahead 8 miles off Middle part headed S latter part steered N W saw nothing same
Latt Obs 2. 19 S

Sunday Sept. the 4 1842

first part light breeze from ESE steering N W watch employed in ships duty some porpoises seen latter the same latter the same same porpoises seen
Latt Obs 20. 58 S
Long Chron 143. 44 W

Monday Sept. the 5 1842

first part wind from SESE steering N W saw porpoises Middle part the same latter part steered W repairing the fly fish saw white water so ends
Latt Obs 1. 19 S
Long Chron 145. 26 W

Tuesday Sept. the 6 1842

first part wind from ESE steering N W went about the main topsail and bent another Middle part light rain latter part steered N W went about the fore topsail and bent another employed mending of it so ends

Wednesday Sept. the 7 1842

first part wind from ESE steering N W watch employed mending the fore topsail Middle part steered N W latter part the same so ends Latt Obs 20. 25 S

Thursday Sept. the 8 1842

first part wind from ESE steering N W saw nothing Middle part steered N W latter part the same watch employed in catching the porpoises so ends
Latt Obs 1. 00 S
Long Chron 152. 43 W

Friday Sept. the 9 1842

first part wind from ESE steering N W saw a finback Middle part steered the same latter part wind from SE watch employed in ships duty so ends
Latt Obs 1. 52 W

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Sept 10 1842

Saturday Sept. the 10 1842

first part wind from ESE steering N W watch employed in ships duty Middle part at 8 hours bark headed N E N latter part steered N W watch employed in ships duty so ends
Latt Obs 2. 30 S
Long Chron 157. 10 W

Sunday Sept. the 11 1842

first part steering S W by S at 4 saw Christmas Island bearing S haul up for it at sunset took in the topgallant sails and fly fish caught a porpoise Middle part at 8 took at 3 took again latter part headed S W at 9 saw the land of the weather low so ends
Latt Obs 2. 6 S
Long Chron 157. 41 W

Monday Sept. the 12 1842

first part wind from SE heading S W land 10 miles on the weather beam Middle part headed S W stay here latter part the same steered S W so ends
Latt Obs 19 S
Long Chron 158. 56 W

Tuesday Sept. the 13 1842

first part strong breeze from ESE steering S W by S at sunset took in the main topsail and sails and fly fish and hauled S Middle part at 1 took at 3 took bark latter part strong trades steered S W by S at 11 took the Omega of Van Dyke watch employed in ships duty so ends
Latt Obs 20 48

Wednesday Sept. the 14 1842

first part strong trades from ESE steering N W at 5 wore ship to the 3 parvis Island 3 miles off bearing N W the Capt. went on board of the Omega Middle part lay with the main topsail aback headed S latter part steered N W by W so ends
Latt Obs 20 29 S
Long Chron 161. 16 W

Thursday Sept. the 15 1842

first part wind from ESE steering N W the Omega in sight at sunset wore aback headed S Middle part lay aback to the S latter part fine weather steered N W by W went about and bent a main topgallant sail employed repairing of it so ends
Latt Obs 20 24 S
