

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Nov. 1842

Friday Nov. the 4 1842

first part wind from E at 1 East cut from his Whistle came on board last 3 ions the ship in sight headed NNE at 5 saw Glendeville Is. off the lee beam at 11 part 5 saw a large whale to late to lower Middle part headed SSE until 3 tacks latter part wind light veered Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Saturday Nov. the 5 1842

first part wind from ENE headed NNE and sail Middle part stood to the N until 12 tacks and at 2 tacks again latter part wind from NNE headed NNE so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Sunday Nov. the 6 1842

first part light air from NE by E headed E by S Middle part light breeze and variable latter part light breeze from ENE headed N so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Monday Nov. the 7 1842

first part light breeze from E by E headed NE at 4 struck and got a small blackfish Middle part tacks twice latter part wind from E by N headed NE so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Tuesday Nov. the 8 1842

first part light breeze from E by N headed NE by E same as sail to the N Middle part tacks twice latter part light breeze from ENE headed N at 9 saw Glendeville Island on the weather bow tacks ship and stood off so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Wednesday Nov. the 9 1842

first part light air from E by N headed SE by S Middle part calm latter part wind from E by S steered N by E laid out the blackfish so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Thursday Nov. the 10 1842

first part wind from E by S steered N by S Middle part steered N by S under easy sail latter strong breeze from SE by E steered SE by S watch employed in ships duty so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

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Friday Nov. the 11 1842

first part wind from E by E headed SSE Middle part steered N by E strong breeze latter part the same steered S wind from NE by N same Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Saturday Nov. the 12 1842

first part strong breeze from NE by N steered N by S until 4 then hauled on the wire to the Northward and steered N by E latter part strong breeze from N steered E by N wind Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Sunday Nov. the 13 1842

first part strong breeze from N steered E by N squally shortened sail at sundown Middle part wind from N and squally wind very short sail latter part the same wind Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Monday Nov. the 14 1842

first part light breeze from NE by N headed E by S cloudy with squalls of rain off by wind shipper to ENE more ship and headed N at sundown shortened sail Middle part steered NE light air and rainy latter part light air and calms so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Tuesday Nov. the 15 1842

first part light air from NNE headed N by N Middle part the same latter part strong breeze so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Wednesday Nov. the 16 1842

first part strong breeze from NE by N headed N by N saw two ships spindly part at 3 tacks and again at 2 latter part strong breeze from ENE at 6 saw Whales foreward and the starboard and waist boats parted and lost both at 11 came on board so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W

Thursday Nov. the 17 1842

first part light breeze from NE headed N by N Middle part headed N by N at 12 had a squall shortened sail latter part light breeze from E steered N by N saw a sail broke out water in the fore hold so ends Lat 46 00 1 S Long Chron 186 19 W
