

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Jan^y 1843
Wednesday Jan^y the 4 1843

first part wind from SNE heard
S. E. watch employed in ships duty middle part
strong breeze and squally beating up to the land latter
part at 8 o'clock passengers at the N. E. town Capt went
on shore blowing strong beating up to the N. E. town wind

Thursday Jan^y the 5 1843
first part strong breeze from
S. E. at 3 o'clock up to the town by English bridge
by there landed the passengers baggage at sunset
breeze came on board middle part strong gale and squally
stood off until 2 o'clock in latter part the same
breeze off and on one boat crew on shore on
Liberty Capt and myself so ends

Friday Jan^y the 6 1843
first part strong gales and
squally at Chapel came Capt. spent on shore
middle part laying off and on latter part sun round
to the N. E. town and sent on shore a raft of casks
and got off one boat load of wood so ends

Saturday Jan^y the 7 1843
first part laying off and on strong
breeze got off 2 boats bound off wood and got off 8
lbs of water and hoisted it in one Melatta Mone
coincide off to make his passage to the middle
part better weather laying off and on latter part storm
- at dawn water in the fore hold at 8 o'clock the
crew went on shore at the N. E. town saw 20 Banks
so ends

Sunday Jan^y the 8 1843
first part laying off and on
at sunset came off Cook and Stiffen not down
did not stop for them middle part laying off and
on latter part the same boats crew went on
Liberty loaded for turkeys and ducks so ends

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Jan^y 1843
Monday Jan^y the 9 1843

first part good weather wind from
S. E. laying off and on got 4 barrels of potatoes at
Liberty then all came off middle part at 8 o'clock away
and gun round the Island Mone sail and stern S. E. latter
part headed S. E. watch employed in ships duty saw
nothing so ends Lat^t 22° 20' S

Tuesday Jan^y the 10 1843
first part wind from N. E. heard
S. E. 1/2 part headed S. E. 1/2 latter part headed
S. E. light breeze at 11 o'clock Whales at 11 o'clock all
boats at Meridian struck a large whale good
Lat^t 23° 40' S

Wednesday Jan^y the 11 1843
first part at 9 took the whale along
side got dinner and up tables and began to cut got in
his gun and gale and tacked down for the night mid
the part lay by him latter part sailing wind from E
saw a ship so ends saw breacher Lat^t 23° 17' S
Long 160° 18' W

Thursday Jan^y the 12 1843
first wind from E at 1 o'clock finished
sailing and began to beat heard S. E. 1/2 middle part
latter part headed S. E. 1/2 under easy sail latter part the same
so ends Lat^t 23° 29' S
Long 160° 12' W

Friday Jan^y the 13 1843
first part wind from E headed
S. E. under easy sail hoisting middle part sailing
strong breeze latter part the same wind Lat^t 24° 17' S

Saturday Jan^y the 14 1843
first part wind from S. E. headed
S. E. 1/2 hoisting middle part strong breeze at 11 o'clock
hoisting latter part headed E. 1/2 strong breeze from
S. E. so ends Lat^t 25° 30' S
Long 160° 5' W

Sunday Jan^y the 15 1843 first part strong breeze from
E headed S. E. middle and latter part the same
so ends Lat^t 26° 5' S
