

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Feb 8 1843

Sunday Feb the 5 1843

first part strong breeze from NNE
and squally headed on at 5 wind from NNE
sailed before the topsails took in the fore and
mainsail and wore ship middle part squally wind
remained under short sail latter part more moderate
breeze all sail wind from NNE headed E saw
nothing so ends
Lat 40° 20' N
Long 131° 58' W

Monday Feb the 6 1843

first part light breeze from
NNE headed E middle part light breeze at 12
wind shifted to NE of E headed NE latter part
wind from NE of E headed NNE watch employed
in ships duty so ends
Lat 40° 20' N
Long 132° 30' W

Tuesday Feb the 7 1843

first part light breeze from NNE
headed NNE middle part squally latter part strong
breeze from NE headed E & sailed
Lat 40° 20' N
Long 132° 30' W

Wednesday Feb the 8 1843

first part strong breeze and
squally from NE of E headed E & sailed before the
topsails and took in the fore and mainsail
middle part strong breeze and squally
from NE headed NNE sailed
Lat 40° 19' N
Long 131° 54' W

Thursday Feb the 9 1843

first part strong and squally wind
variable from NNE to NNW headed NNE of N middle
part squally and strong latter part strong breeze from NNE
headed NNE so ends
Lat 40° 18' N
Long 132° 49' W

Friday Feb the 10 1843

first part wind from NNE
headed NNE middle part strong breeze from NE
headed NNE latter part squally and variable
from NNE to ENE headed NNE so ends
Lat 40° 10' N
Long 133° 20' W

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Feb 10 1843

Saturday Feb the 11 1843

first part strong breeze from NNE
and squally headed NNE middle part strong breeze
latter part the same so ends
Lat 40° 8' N
Long 132° 30' W

Sunday Feb the 12 1843

first part strong breeze from NE
headed NNE at 1 had a squall took in fore and
mainsail middle part squally at
12 took in sail latter part strong breeze and clear
so ends
Lat 40° 14' N
Long 132° 30' W

Monday Feb the 13 1843

first part strong breeze from
NE of E headed NNE middle part strong
breeze from NE of E headed NNE latter part the same
so ends
Lat 40° 13' N
Long 132° 30' W

Tuesday Feb the 14 1843

first part strong breeze from NE of E
headed NNE had one squall saw porpoises middle
part wind steady latter part the same squally nothing
so ends
Lat 40° 11' N
Long 132° 25' W

Wednesday Feb the 15 1843

first part wind from ENE headed
N at 4 unblew and sent another fore topsail middle
part light breeze from NE of E headed NNE latter part
the same sent the maintopgallant sail so saw
nothing so ends
Lat 40° 10' N
Long 132° 43' W

Thursday Feb the 16 1843

first part light breeze from
NE of E headed NNE unblew and sent another
maintopgallant middle part wind from NE of E headed NNE
latter part the same saw two ships steering
to the S so ends
Lat 40° 8' N
Long 132° 42' W

Friday Feb the 17 1843

first part wind from E headed
NNE unblew employed in ships duty middle part
wind from ENE headed N latter part the same took
in the stanchion boat and repaired her saw
jimbocks so ends
Lat 40° 7' N
Long 132° 42' W
