

Remarks On board Ship *Mattha Fairhaven* March 1843

Monday March the 19 1843

first part wind from N by E
and pleasant weather steered N by E
wind light from N by E headed N by E
wind light from N by E headed N by E
and getting ready water casks from Ritters
so ends
Lat 43° 13' 20" N
Long 73° 31' W

Tuesday March the 20 1843

first part calm until 6
then wind sprang up fresh from N by E
steered N by E
middle part light breeze and
variable latter part breaking out in the fore hold
and taking account of the water and staying down
casks so ends
Lat 43° 13' 34" N
Long 74° 14' 20" W

Wednesday March the 21 1843

first part light breeze from N by E
steered N by E
middle part wind steady from E steered
N by E
latter part the same set up 2 shoals of water
employed in ships duty so ends
Lat 43° 13' 35" N
Long 74° 15' 39" W

Thursday March the 22 1843

first part wind from E steered N by E
middle part light
squall steered N by E
latter part the same employed
in ships duty so ends
Lat 43° 13' 50" N
Long 74° 17' 50" W

Friday March the 23 1843

first part wind from E by N steered
N by E
middle part watch employed in ships duty
steered N by E
latter part wind light from E by N
steered N by E
so ends
Lat 43° 14' 10" N
Long 74° 19' 40" W

Saturday March the 24 1843

first part squally wind variable
with heavy thunder under short sail steered N by E
at night
took in the fore topsail and close reefed the main
sail with light breeze and lightning middle part
headed to the N by E
the night and to the S the rest
part under 1/2 sail and latter part light breeze from
E by N headed N by E
so ends
Lat 43° 14' 50" N
Long 74° 22' 10" W

Remarks On board Ship *Mattha Fairhaven* March 1843

Sunday March the 19 1843

first part wind from E by S headed
S by E middle part headed S by E with a strong breeze latter
part the same so ends
Lat 43° 16' 15" N
Long 74° 12' 20" W

Monday March the 20 1843

first part strong breeze from E
headed S by E at 5 came to anchor bearing S from the
harbour 40 or 50 miles to the Eastward of us and
of the wind we found to be steady middle part steady
in strong breeze latter part at 4 bent chains at 5 have aback
off tomorrow at 11 took a pilot so ends

Tuesday March the 21 1843

first part strong breeze from
E by N at 2 came to anchor in the harbour of
Uchita one English Frigate and two French sloops
of War in here with several whaling ships and
merchant men latter part getting off water and stow-
ing down so ends

Wednesday March the 22 1843

first part light breeze and baffling
steering and getting off water latter part watch on
liberty head ship so sent ashore to catch up salt so ends

Thursday March the 23 1843

first part blacked heads and let
the Vison have 9 bushels of corn latter part sent
one boat having watch on liberty so ends

Friday March the 24 1843

first part blacked the Larkard head
so at 4 the boat comes with a boat load of game latter
part sent another boat having watch on liberty emp-
loyed setting up rigging forward staying foremast so ends

Saturday March the 25 1843

first part got off a boat load of
wood and staying guests at 6 boat load off
latter part on liberty so ends
