

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven April 20 1843
Friday April the 8 1843

first part squally and variable under
short sail headed E by N until 2 more ships, and headed
N by N Middle part variable and light air latter part
light air from N headed E by E 30 ends Lat Obs 15-11.43 S
Long Chron 150-50 W

Saturday April the 8 1843
first part light breeze from N
headed E by N Middle part headed N by N latter
part headed N by N from E by E got the masts
up on deck E 30 ends Lat Obs 15-11.40 S
Long Chron 150-49 W

Sunday April the 9 1843
first part wind from E by N
steered N by N watch employed in ships
Duty Middle part strong breeze latter part the
same 30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.44 S
Long Chron 151-23 W

Monday April the 10 1843
first part strong breeze from
E by E steered N by N topgallant sails in Middle
part the same double reefed the fore and
mizzen reefed the main topgallant latter wind
strong from E steered N by E made sail
all hands employed in painting grass E
30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.58 S
Long Chron 151-52 W

Tuesday April the 11 1843
first part strong breeze
steering N by E finished painting spar turned
up and painted the quarter boats Middle
part the same latter part the same some nothing
30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.52 S
Long Chron 151-47 W

Wednesday April the 12 1843
first part strong breeze
from E steered N by E watch employed in
ships Duty Middle part steered the same latter
part painted the waist boat under the
fore topmast stay and repairing of it saw
nothing 30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.44 S
Long Chron 151-19 W

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven April 20 1843
Thursday April the 13 1843

first part more moderate broke
out a cask of corn at sundown
shortened sail Middle part steering N by N latter part
steered N by E 30 ends Lat Obs 15-11.18 S
Long Chron 150-50 W

Friday April the 14 1843
first part strong breeze steering N by N
at 4 saw a carcass at sundown shortened sail
Middle part the same latter part made more sail
30 ends Lat Obs 15-11.44 S
Long Chron 150-49 W

Saturday April the 15 1843
first part wind strong from
E steered N by E watch employed in ships
Duty at sundown shortened sail Middle part
the same latter part the same at 8 saw breeches
to forward run for them at 10 saw sperm whales
lowered and shared at midnight gave them up
and came on board 30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.50 S

Sunday April the 16 1843
first part wind from E by E
steered to the S until 1 then more and steered
N by E at sundown shortened sail Middle
part headed N by E latter part steered N by E
30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.12 S
Long Chron 151-10 W

Monday April the 17 1843
first part strong breeze
from E by E steered N by E Middle part
at 2 tacked at 4 tacked again latter part steered
N by N saw a sail 30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.21 S

Tuesday April the 18 1843
first part wind from E by E steered
E by S at 3 saw Harris Island at 4 went in with
the boat and got a few eggs spoke the Revalee of
Harris Capt went on board Middle part light air
steered N by E latter part light air from E by E
steered N by E the other ship in company
at 10 that Capt came on board and Capt
Sayer went on board with him to dinner
30 ends Lat Obs 16-11.29 S
