

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven April 18 1843

Wednesday April the 19 1843

first part light breeze from ENE steered S by E the Rosalie in company Middle part stern S by W wind from E latter part the same Rosalie in sight so ends Lat 46° 00' 50" S Long 162° 12' W

Thursday April the 20 1843

first part wind light from E steered S by E other ship in sight Middle part the same latter part light breeze from ENE steered N by W all hands employed in painting the ship outside so ends Lat 46° 1' 44" S Long 162° 22' W

Friday April the 21 1843

first part light breeze from ENE steered N by E watch employed in painting & at 2 finished Middle part the same latter part steered N by E light breeze from ENE watch employed in ship's duty so ends Lat 46° 1' 55" S Long 162° 52' W

Saturday April the 22 1843

first part light breeze from ENE steered N by E watch employed in ship's duty at sunrise shortened sail Middle part steered N by E latter part steered N by E saw grampuses and blackfish. forenoon to 4 grampuses John Timpon and the Cooks got to fighting. Feared them together and let them whip with the setting sluff. so ends Lat 46° 00' 32" S Long 162° 34' W

Sunday April the 23 1843

first part steered N by E saw hiffers & Middle part headed SE under easy sail latter part strong breeze from ENE headed SE so ends Lat 46° 1' 15" S Long 162° 57' W

Monday April the 24 1843 first part strong breeze from ENE headed SE saw breeches to windward Middle part at 2 more ship headed N latter part the same so ends Lat 46° 1' 39" S Long 162° 55' W

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven April 25 1843

Tuesday April the 25 1843

first part strong breeze from ENE headed N watch employed in ship's duty Middle part headed N by E latter part wind from E headed N by E watch employed in ship's duty so ends Lat 46° 00' 20" S Long 162° 51' W

Wednesday April the 26 1843

first part wind from E headed N by E making sperm whale saw blackfish. Middle part headed N by E latter part light air and calm over blackfish caught one so ends Lat 46° 00' 25" S Long 162° 53' W

Thursday April the 27 1843

first part calm watch employed in ship's duty saw grampuses and porpoises Middle part light breeze headed N latter part light breeze from E steered N by W so ends Lat 46° 00' 28" S Long 162° 18' W

Friday April the 28 1843

first part light breeze from E steered N by N saw grampuses & Middle part steered N by W light breeze latter part the same so ends Lat 46° 00' 20" N Long 161° 2' W

Saturday April the 29 1843

first part wind from E steered S by W watch employed in ship's duty Middle part the same so ends Lat 46° 00' 37" S Long 162° 43' W

Sunday April the 30 1843

first part wind from N by E steered S by E Middle part steered W latter part at 4 saw a large whale. lowered and chased at Mesitcan the starboard boat fastened and parted the line so ends Lat 46° 00' 38" S Long 164° 02' W

Monday May the 1 1843 first part calm at one the waist boat got slightly fast and dived at 9 gave up the chase the ship 22 miles off at 11 part 5 miles steered up Middle part light air and calm latter part the same so ends Lat 46° 00' 46" S Long 164° 30' W
