

Remarks On board Ship *Montha Fairhaven* May 1 1873

Tuesday May the 2 1873

first part light air from ENE headed
N watch employed in ships duty, blackish
middle part lay aback headed N by W latter part
wind from ENE headed N by W so ends Lat 11° 18' N
Long 175° 22' W

Wednesday May the 3 1873

first part wind from ENE
steered N by E at 5 sent the main topsail
and sent another from the mast strong breeze from
E by S steered N by E latter part the same, repairing
the maintop sail so ends Lat 11° 24' N
Long 174° 44' W

Thursday May the 4 1873

first strong breeze from E by S
steered N by E at 5 finished and bent the maintop
sail middle part strong breeze from ENE steered N at 9
took in topgallant shits latter part at 1 reaped the
topsails at 6 took them out and set topgallant
shits so ends Lat 11° 36' N
Long 174° 13' W

Friday May the 5 1873

first part strong breeze from
E by S steered N by E watch employed in
ships duty middle part strong wind variable
headed N latter part the same squally double reaped
the topsails sent down the main topgallant yard
employed felling the rigging of it sometimes calm
so ends Lat 11° 20' N

Saturday May the 6 1873

first part squally wind variable
from N by E to NE headed N by W middle part
squally latter part the same sent up the maintopgallant
sail so ends Lat 11° 9' N
Long 174° 14' W

Sunday May the 7 1873

first part light spin squally
and strong breeze between from N by E headed N by W made
sail middle part squally reaped the topsails latter part
more moderate Maels sail and headed N by W
wind from N by E so ends Lat 11° 42' N
Long 174° 14' W

Remarks On board Ship *Montha Fairhaven* May 8 1873

Monday May the 8 1873

first part wind from NE good weather
headed N by W middle part the same latter part wind strong
from ENE headed N squally so ends Lat 11° 22' N
Long 174° 53' W

Tuesday May the 9 1873

first part strong breeze and squally
from N by E headed N by W middle part the same
latter part strong breeze from N by E headed N by W
employed in ships duty so ends Lat 11° 24' N
Long 174° 46' W

Wednesday May the 10 1873

first part wind from NE
headed N by W watch employed in ships duty middle
part strong breeze single reaped the main topsail and double
reaped the fore latter part the same felling cutting
tables so ends Gaspine on duty Lat 11° 42' N
Long 175° 00' W

Thursday May the 11 1873

first part strong breeze from NE by E
headed N by W shook one reef out of the topsails felling
tables middle part more moderate latter part the
same felling cutting foremast so ends Lat 11° 26' N
Long 175° 20' W

Friday May the 12 1873

first part wind from NE good
weather watch employed in ships duty headed
N by W middle part more moderate headed N by W
latter part the same so ends Lat 11° 24' N
Long 176° 39' W

Saturday May the 13 1873

first part wind from NE head
ed N by W sent up the cutting foremast so ends
the part the same latter part strong breeze took in
the topgallant sail and felled so ends Lat 11° 31' N
Long 177° 5' W

Sunday May the 14 1873

first part strong breeze from
N by E headed N by W middle part single reaped the
topsails latter part more moderate wind from N by W
headed N by W shook out reefs so ends Lat 11° 46' N
Long 178° 6' W
