

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fashaven July 20 1843

Thursday June the 29 1843

first part strong gales from S W
headed under short sail at 4 bore ship beam took
in all but a close reefed main top sail middle part
sail and squally at 4 had a very heavy squall took
in the main top sail latter part more moderate
and sail was headed E S set the main top sail saw
three sail saunders Lat 43 30 12 N

Friday June the 30 1843

first part light air from S W
headed S E at 2 cleared up set the fore sail gave
9 sail middle part headed S W light breeze latter
part strong breeze from N E headed E S E saw
a bark so ends Lat 43 29 45 N
Long Chron 169 54 E

Saturday July the 1 1843

first part wind strong from
E N E steered N E watch employed in ship
at night shortened sail middle part strong
breeze from E N E headed N E under double reef
main top sail latter part strong breeze from E S
steered S W so ends Lat 43 30 24 N
Long Chron 168 45 E

Sunday July the 2 1843

strong breeze from E S steered N E
under easy sail saw two sail middle part
headed N E under short sail latter part strong breeze
from S E steered N E so ends Lat 43 30 17 N
Long Chron 167 36 E

Monday July the 3 1843

first part strong breeze from
S E steered S W at night shortened sail middle part
headed S W at 3 took the latter part headed E N E
spoke the Cleaver of London so ends Lat 43 30 2 N
Long Chron 167 4 E

Tuesday July the 4 1843

first part strong breeze from S E
headed S W at night spoke the Mary Mitchell 90 lbs
middle part headed S W latter part headed E S E
spoke the Patience and Vigilance of Nantucket 1000
so ends Lat 43 29 29 N

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fashaven July 21 1843

Wednesday July the 5 1843

first part wind from N E headed S W
the Mary Mitchell and the other two ships in company
middle part headed S W latter part headed E S E wind
from S saw two sail saunders Lat 43 29 2 N
Long Chron 167 42 E

Thursday July the 6 1843

first part wind from S steered N W
squally sail at night shortened sail middle part
headed E S E latter part steered N E saw 4 sail and bark
so ends Lat 43 30 9 N
Long Chron 167 18 E

Friday July the 7 1843

first part light breeze from S steered
E bark in sight and pinbark middle part light air
headed E latter headed E S E saw a bark and pinbark
so ends Lat 43 30 1 N
Long Chron 167 12 E

Saturday July the 8 1843

first part light breeze from S E
headed E N E bent a new fore spruce middle part
at 8 spoke the bark Smirna 1000 and
Omegon Nantucket 1400 middle part light breeze from
N E headed N E E latter part the same 2 sail
in sight so ends Lat 43 30 34 N
Long Chron 170 22 E

Sunday July the 9 1843

first part light breeze from E S E
headed N E at 4 spoke the Omegon two other sail
in sight middle part light breeze from E N E headed
S latter part the same saw 3 sail and pinbark
so ends Lat 43 30 7 N
Long Chron 169 54 E

Monday July the 10 1843

first part light breeze from E S E
headed S W at night spoke the Mary Mitchell 90 lbs
middle part light air headed E latter part the same
2 ships in sight so ends Lat 43 30 8 N
