

Remarks On board ship Martha Fairhaven July 11 1849

Tuesday July the 11 1849

first part light air from S headed
E S by and calms 4 ships in sight Middle part light
air latter part the same 2 ships in sight same group
- was and porpoises so ends

Lat 40° 29' 50" N
Long 140° 21' E

Wednesday July the 12 1849

first part light air and calm
from NE steady E Middle part light air from NE
and calms headed NE latter part calm very green
and two sail so ends

Lat 40° 29' 38" N
Long 140° 32' E

Thursday July the 13 1849

first part light air from NE
by N headed E by S same two ships Middle part
light squalls from the NE and calms latter part
light green from NE by E headed N by W same one
sail so ends

Lat 40° 29' 33" N
Long 140° 22' E

Friday July the 14 1849

first part light air and calm
at night spoke the Oranga saw pinbacks Middle
part light breeze from NE headed N latter part
the same same group so ends

Lat 40° 30' 19" N
Long 140° 34' E

Saturday the 15 1849

first part light breeze from ENE
headed N same breeze to windward and a sail
just at night appeared to be among whales
Middle part at 8 tasked latter part wind from E headed
NNW saw two sail and pinbacks go plenty and jump
- ers so ends

Lat 40° 30' 40" N
Long 140° 33' E

Sunday July the 16 1849

first part wind from E by S headed
headed S by E saw a sail and pinbacks Middle part
headed N by W latter part the same exchanged signals
with the New Bedford and saw another sail
so ends

Lat 40° 29' 52" N

Remarks On board ship Martha Fairhaven July 17 1849

Monday July the 17 1849

first part wind from ENE headed
N saw pinbacks and a sail Middle part
headed N latter part the same same 3 sail pinbacks blackish
so ends

Lat 40° 30' 58" N
Long 140° 23' E

Tuesday July the 18 1849

first part wind from ENE with light
squalls headed N saw 2 ships Middle part wind from
NE by E headed N by W latter part wind the same steady
by E so ends

Lat 40° 31' 25" N
Long 140° 09' E

Wednesday July the 19 1849

first part wind from E by N
by N Middle part headed S by E latter part strong breeze
and squalls steady N by W saw a sail pinbacks and
jumpers so ends

Lat 40° 30' 13" N
Long 140° 19' E

Thursday July the 20 1849

first part squally wind from E
double reefed topsails took in fore and mainsail
heads by E Middle part under short sail headed
to the S latter part strong breeze from E by N headed
N by E saw two sail so ends

Lat 40° 30' 01" N
Long 140° 34' E

Friday July the 21 1849

first part strong breeze from E by N
headed N by E at 5 spoke the New Bedford Middle
part lay aback with the head yards headed to the
south latter part strong breeze from E headed NE
under double reefs saw one sail so ends

Lat 40° 30' 8" N

Saturday July the 22 1849

first part strong breeze from E by N
headed S by E repaired foremast topsail and bent it
again Middle part headed NE and from E latter
part wind the same headed NNE strong breeze
bent another foremast employed repairing the other saw
nothing so ends

Lat 40° 29' 20" N
Long 140° 12' E
