

Remarks On board Ship Mastror Fairhaven August 20 1843

Friday August the 4 1843

first part wind from SSE headed E
all hands employed heaving out and stowing down
in the morning and after half the part
strong breeze from SE headed E. N. E. latter part the same
headed SSE spoke the Hercules off New Bedford
300 14 months so ends
Lat 42° 43' N
Long 71° 50' E

Saturday August the 5 1843

first part wind from SE headed
by S. Hercules in sight watch employed in ships
duty. Middle part strong breeze from SE by S
headed E. N. E. latter part the same sail in
sight so ends
Lat 42° 54' N
Long 71° 19' E

Sunday August the 6 1843

first part strong breeze from
SE by S headed E. N. E. sail in sight saw Gumpers
Middle part headed E. latter part more moderate
headed E. N. E. wind from SSE sail in sight saw
Gumpers so ends
Lat 43° 51' N
Long 71° 00' E

Monday August the 7 1843

first part light breeze from
SSE steered E. by N sail on the top boom saw
Gumpers. Middle part headed E. by S latter part
wind from SE by S headed E. N. E. sail in sight
watch employed in ships duty so ends
Lat 43° 35' N
Long 71° 21' E

Tuesday August the 8 1843

first part wind from SE by S headed
SE watch employed in ships duty. Middle part
headed SE wind from SE by S latter part the same
don't think of whales were
Lat 43° 33' N
Long 71° 51' E

Wednesday August the 9 1843

first part wind from SE by S headed SE
watch employed in ships duty. Middle part headed SE
with a light breeze latter part light breeze from
SE headed SE saw a hawk cutting to windward
of us so ends
Lat 43° 00' 92' N
Long 71° 56' W

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Thursday August the 10 1843

first part light breeze from SE headed
SE by S until 8 o'clock and headed SSE at 2 the bark
saw cutting Middle part light breeze from SE by S headed
SE latter part the same sail sailing saw Gumpers
so ends
Lat 43° 30' 00' N
Long 71° 33' W

Friday August the 11 1843

first part light breeze from SSE
headed E employed turning up the starboard side
of the fore rigging bark hailing Middle part
light breeze latter part the same headed E. in the
bark so ends
Lat 43° 29' 54' N
Long 71° 17' W

Saturday August the 12 1843

first part wind from SSE steered W
saw a hawk watch employed in ships duty Middle part
headed E until 10 then tacked latter part strong breeze
from SE by S headed SE by S bark to forward saw
nothing but Gumpers so ends
Lat 43° 29' 46' N
Long 71° 53' W

Sunday August the 13 1843

first part strong breeze from SE
headed SE by S bark to forward Middle part headed SE by S
latter part strong breeze from SE steered E. N. E. under
easy sail saw the bark and another sail and a
breast so ends
Lat 43° 29' 46' N
Long 71° 13' E

Monday August the 14 1843

first part strong breeze from SE
headed SE at 2 spoke the Gapan Wautucket.
11 00 23 months saw another sail Middle part headed
E. N. E. latter part headed SE saw two sail saw a
breast so ends
Lat 43° 29' 92' N
Long 71° 13' E

Tuesday August the 15 1843

first part strong breeze from SE by S
headed SE by S repairing foresail Middle part headed SE by S
latter part wind from SE headed SE watch employed
repairing the foresail so ends
Lat 43° 29' 98' N
