

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven August 20 1843

Wednesday August the 16 1843

first part strong breeze from E & heard N & E at 4 saw a ship to windward among Whales she took on along side they & whales came down to us at 4 lowered the boats started at once did not parting. Middle part strong breeze and squally heard N & E at 10 tacked saw two sail and was

Thursday August the 17 1843

first part strong breeze from E & heard N & E at 10 tacked spoke the Japan Menon of Newport and City of New Bedford saw another sail Middle part headed E & strong breeze latter part wind from E & heard N & E two sail in sight went another foretop sail employed repairing of the other so ends

Friday August the 18 1843

first part strong breeze from E & E repairing foretop sail at sunset spoke the William of Liverpool packet New Bedford 600 the Capt came on board Middle part strong breeze the same latter part the same saw 3 sail employed mending topsail squally so ends

Saturday August the 19 1843

first part strong breeze from E & N steered N under double reef forewind sail saw two sail and pinkies Middle part more moderate at 2 more ship latter part the same headed E & saw 3 sail so ends

Sunday August the 20 1843

first part good weather and from E & N steered N & E two sail in sight Middle part headed N & E at 12 then more ship latter part wind light from E headed E & saw 3 sail in sight so ends

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven August 21 1843

Monday August the 21 1843

first part wind from E headed N & E until 4 more ship and spoke the Walter Scott Nantucket 34 months 1100 Middle part headed N at 12 more ship headed E & latter part wind from E & N there E & saw 5 ships so ends Lat 43 29 45 N
Long 71 45 E

Tuesday August the 22 1843

first part light breeze from E & N steep E & saw 3 sail at 4 spoke the famuel Clouston Middle part part 4 spoke the Levi Starbuck and Ocean Nantucket the Levi 800 24 months and Ocean 1800 34 months headed N & E latter part the same so ends

Wednesday August the 23 1843

first part strong breeze from N & E headed N & E at 3 spoke the Levi Starboard and more ship saw two other sails watch employed in ships duty Middle part headed E & E under easy sail latter part headed N & E watch employed in ships duty so ends Lat 43 29. 54 N
Long 71 22 E

Thursday August the 24 1843

first part wind from N & E headed N & E fitting rigging Middle part at 12 more ship headed N & E at 12 latter part the same fitting rigging - no 4 sail in sight so ends

Lat 43 30. 50 N
Long 71 49 E

Friday August the 25 1843

first part wind from E & N headed E & fitting rigging saw 9 sail Middle part the same latter part wind from E headed N & E saw one sail fitting rigging so ends

Lat 43 29. 20 N
Long 71 37 E

Saturday August the 26 1843

first part wind from E light headed N & E fitting rigging one sail in sight Middle part headed E & E latter part the same busy fitting rigging saw two sail and bristles so ends Lat 43 29. 55 N
Long 71 04 E
