

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Nov 27 1843

Thursday Nov the 29 1843

first part wind from S by E headed S by E
watch employed mending line as per said Middle
part at 11 tasked and at 12 tasked back again; latter
part headed S by E wind from S by E watch emp
loyed in ships duty saw Garvis off land on
the weather, hour beating up to it at 1 within
4 miles of it so ends

Friday Nov the 30 1843

first part Capt went on shore
at 1 with one boat at 2 came off with some
eggs at night shortened sail Middle part
light breeze from S E headed S by E latter part
the same steered S by E watch employed in
ships duty saw porpoises so ends

Saturday Nov the 1 1843

first part light breeze from
S E headed S E got out the starboard boat
Middle part headed S latter part wind from
S E by E steered S by E so ends

Sunday Nov the 2 1843

first part wind from E and
pleasant weather steered S by E Middle
part wind from N E latter part wind from N by E steered
N by E so ends

Monday Nov the 3 1843

first wind from N by E a good
breeze steered N by E Middle part the same
latter part wind from E by N reluctant and went another
foretop sail employed mending of it so ends

Tuesday Nov the 4 1843

first part wind from E N by E steered
N by E saw blackfish and porpoises Middle part
headed N by E latter part steered N by E
watch employed in ships duty strong breeze
so ends

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Dec 27 1843

Wednesday Dec the 29 1843

first part strong breeze from E by E
steered E by E watch employed in ships duty Middle
part headed N by E reaped main top sail latter
part wind strong steered N by E repaired mizen top
sail so ends

Thursday Dec the 30 1843

first part strong breeze from
E by E under easy sail latter strong breeze from E by E
steered N by E at Meridians spoke the Waves by
compassing at so ends

Friday Dec the 1 1844

first part strong breeze from
E by E steered N by E under easy sail Middle
part headed S by E wind from E under easy sail latter
part headed N by E so ends

Saturday Dec the 2 1844

first part light breeze from E
headed N by E watch employed in ships duty
Middle part headed S by E latter part headed
S by E at 11 part 11 saw Whales on the weather
new so ends

Sunday Dec the 3 1844

first part wind from E at 11 part
12 lowered all boats for the Whales blackfish got
among them and drove them to windward could
not catch them fastened to 3 blackfish and saw
one Middle part at 1 tasked latter part headed
N by E so ends

Monday Dec the 4 1844

first part light breeze from E by E
headed S by E saw porpoises Middle part at 12
tasked headed N latter part the same employed
hailing blackfish so ends
