

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fausbøen Dec 1843

Tuesday Dec the 5 1843

first part wind from ENE headed N at 4 o'clock up the main topmast and began to break out the larboard side of the main hulk to cooper at 5 - were ship, middle part light breeze from ENE headed SE latter part cooping so ends
Lat 66 1. 25 S

Wednesday Dec the 6 1843

first part light breeze from NE headed SE & cooping to middle part light breeze from NE headed SE & latter part cooping light breeze from NE headed E some two sail so ends
Lat 66 1. 48 S

Thursday Dec the 7 1843

first part light breeze from NNE headed E cooping two sail in sight middle part at 9 the Capt. of the Albatross came on board, Capt. 1100 Albatross 400 latter part at 10 finished cooping the other ships in sight light breeze from NW headed SW so ends
Lat 66 1. 59 S
Long 169 6 W

Friday Dec the 8 1843

first part light breeze from NW headed NNE at 4 spoke the Capt. went on board at 5 both ships lowered for Grampuses thought they were Whales middle part light breeze from NW headed SW & latter part wind light from NW headed W & both ships in sight caught two porpoises so ends
Lat 66 2. 31 S
Long 170 3 W

Saturday Dec the 9 1843 first part light breeze from NW headed SW & both ships in sight middle part wind light and variable took these latter part wind from NNE headed N & saw another hulk so ends
Lat 66 2. 35 S
Long 170 22 W

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Sunday Dec the 10 1843

first part wind from NE steered NW at 4 spoke the Capt. went on board middle part headed NW squally respect the topsails latter part wind from ENE steered SW so ends
Lat 66 2. 42 S
Long 171 19 W

Monday Dec the 11 1843

ENE steered SW at 4 spoke the Albatross and Capt. came on board at night deeper topsails middle part took twice latter part wind from ENE headed SE at meridian some the land 4 points on the weather how so ends
Lat 66 2. 5 S
Long 171 22 W

Tuesday Dec the 12 1843

first part wind from NE headed SE at sundown spoke the Albatross the Capt. went on board Capt. to windward middle part headed SW & latter light breeze from ENE steered W so ends
Lat 66 3. 17 S
Long 172 1 W

Wednesday Dec the 13 1843

first part light breeze from E steered NW at 4 spoke the Capt. went on board at 5 both ships lowered for Grampuses thought they were Whales middle part light breeze from NW headed SW & latter part wind light from NW headed N & saw porpoises so ends
Lat 66 2. 54 S
Long 172 32 W

Thursday Dec the 14 1843

first part wind from N headed NW at 4 light squalls double reefed fore and main topsails took in the main gill and main sail middle part headed NW & under easy sail latter part wind light and variable light squalls headed NW & under short sail saw cow fish so ends
Lat 66 2. 30 S
Long 172 30 W
flogged William Brunsen and a Kanaker for fighting
