

Remarks On board Ship Mastrha Fairhaven Dec 22 1843

Tuesday Dec the 26 1843

first part light air from N steering
SSE 1/2 W putting about over 3 sail at 10 AM part light
air steers 1/2 S 1/2 W to the part the same steers SSE
1/2 W in sight so ends

Long 113 31 1/2

Wednesday Dec the 27 1843

first part light air from S and
crops steers S 1/2 W 3 sail in sight middle part
light air latter part the same with light squalls
from E steers SSE 1/2 W Rob Komakos sick and
has been for 8 days so ends

Lat 46 1 10 1

Long 113 58 1/2

Thursday Dec the 28 1843

first part light breeze and
light squalls from E steers SSE 1/2 W and watch
employed in ship duty 3 ships in sight
at night shortened sail 1/2 W part squally
steers SSE 1/2 W under short sail latter part wind
from N 1/2 E steers S 1/2 W at midnight spoke
the American Penn and got the doctor to
come for the Kanakas and Capt Lincoln came
on board saw a pinback and two sails so
ends

Long 114 28 1/2

Friday Dec the 29 1843

first part wind from N steers
SSE Penn via company saw the other
sails and a pinback middle part light breeze
headed SSE 1/2 W under short sail latter part
wind light and variable from N 1/2 E to N 1/2 W steers
I saw one sail so ends

Saturday Dec the 30 1843

first part light breeze and variable
with heavy rain and light thunder double reefed
the topsails steers SSE 1/2 W middle part light squalls
and rain headed SSE 1/2 W latter part light breeze from
N 1/2 W headed N 1/2 W sail ship in sight same
proposals so ends

Remarks On board Ship Mastrha Fairhaven Jan 1 1844

Sunday Dec the 31 1843

first part light breeze from W headed
SSE 1/2 W sail in sight squalls from W part
calm and light squalls latter part strong breeze and squalls
from SSE headed SSE 1/2 W sail in sight squalls from SSE 1/2 W
so ends

Lat 46 2 22 1/2

Long 114 40 1/2

Monday Jan the 1 1844

first part strong breeze from SSE
headed SSE 1/2 W middle part at 9 tacked and at one tacked
latter part strong breeze and squalls from SSE
headed SSE 1/2 W so ends

Lat 46 4 10 1

Long 114 21 1/2

Tuesday Jan the 2 1844

first part strong breeze from
N headed SSE 1/2 W at 6 squally double reefed topsails
and wore sound middle part squally wind from
N 1/2 E to N 1/2 W under short sail headed to
the N latter part strong gales and continued squalls
headed N 1/2 W about so ends

Lat 46 8 50 1

Long 114 12 1/2

Wednesday Jan the 3 1844

first part still squally from W
at 5 saw a low squally breeze from W 1/2 E supposed
it to be one seen by Capt Lincoln in the Gaffian
steers N 1/2 E at 10 passed it and hauled up N under
short sail middle part headed W 1/2 E under short
sail latter part wind from N 1/2 W headed W 1/2 E
all sail so ends

Lat 46 8 50 1

the Kanakas still sick Long 114 30 1/2

Thursday Jan the 4 1844

first part wind from NW 1/2 headed
N 1/2 E at night took in topgallant sails and fly
Gib middle part at 10 tacked and headed N 1/2 E
at 1 tacked again latter part wind from N headed
N 1/2 E so ends

Lat 46 2 48 1

Long 114 5 1/2

Friday Jan the 5 1844

first part wind from N headed E 1/2 W light
squalls at night shortened sail and wore sound middle
part headed N 1/2 W gave away latter part the
same so ends

Lat 46 2 30 1

Long 114 38 1/2

Kanakas rather better
