

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Feb. 18 1844

Sunday Feb. the 18 1844

first part wind from N headed
E & N at 2 more and headed to W & W. watches emp-
loyed in ships duty clearing the part
wind variable from the N with light rain latter
good weather wind from N headed E & N until 4
then more so end

Lat 43° 8' 35" S
Long 174° 25' E

Monday Feb. the 19 1844

first part light breeze from N headed
to N & N. Middle part squally wind variable from
the N headed to the westward latter part the
same so end

Lat 43° 8' 28" S
Long 174° 16' E

Tuesday Feb. the 20 1844

first part squally wind light
from the N headed to N & N. Middle part squally
headed N & E & N. latter part squally headed
from N & N to N & N. so end

Lat 43° 8' 20" S

Wednesday Feb. the 21 1844

first part squally wind variable
from N & N to N headed from N & N to E & N
at 5-10 miles deeper at 10 more so end Middle
part wind variable and squally latter part light
breeze from N headed N & N. starting water and
singing young so end

Lat 43° 4' 58" S
Long 174° 25' E

Thursday Feb. the 22 1844

first part calm water emp-
loyed in ships duty bent another fore top sail
Middle part calm until 10 then light breeze
sprung up from N & E head to the N and W at
3 miles head wore ship and headed N & E latter
part light air from the N until 10 headed
to the westward then came up squally
from E & N headed N & N. so end

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven Feb. 19 1844

Friday Feb. the 29 1844

first part squally wind from E until
N headed N & E at 4 felt choppy at 1 saw an Island
bearing N & W. supposed it was Island if so we are
partially to the N a little more our reckoning at
night bearing N & W 5 leagues off Middle part
calm and light breeze latter part all hands employed painting
light breeze from N headed N & N. the land in sight
till the weather beam so end

Lat 43° 8' 28" S
Long 174° 51' E

Saturday Feb. the 24 1844

first part light air and calm at
12 part 12 had a light squall of rain a small whist-
wind went about 5-10 yards ahead employed painting
lost sight of the land headed to the westward Middle
part light air and variable from N & E to N & N.
headed to the westward latter part light and variable
headed N & E until 10 then more and headed N & N.
at Mercur more again so end

Lat 43° 8' 38" S

Sunday Feb. the 25 1844

first part wind variable all around
the compass and light rain part of the time headed
N & E bent a new Main Royal Middle part
headed N & E at 4 saw land on the lee bow say
Island latter part wind at N headed two of these
short tasks at 9 wind came out in a squall
from N & N. steered N saving all the fore noon
shortened sail so end

Lat 43° 6' 55" S

Monday Feb. the 26 1844

first part light breeze from E
and cloudy steered N at 2 saw 4 whales off the
weather beam wore ship and lowered at 3
steps brass boat struck at 12 part 2 took him
along side and shortened sail Middle part
squally and variable steered N & E latter part rain
until 10 then got up the tables at 11 finished
cutting so end

Lat 43° 6' 51" S
