

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fushaven March 1844

Friday March the 15 1844

first part wind fresh from NE
steered SW weather employed in ships
middle part headed NE until 6 then more and headed
N latter part strong breeze from ENE steered N by N
until 10 then headed NE so ends Lat 41° 00' N
Long 174° 15' E

Saturday March the 16 1844

first part strong breeze from ENE
steered South by East 1/2 East 3/4 E
at 4 or 5 canoes came off shore aback and traded
got 4 pigs and two hens coconuts and hats at
5 base forward and steered NNE with
part the same latter part wind from ENE
set foretopmast steering sail at 9 took it in
again wind hauled to NE and squally rain
or pinback so ends Lat 41° 32' N
Long 168° 00' E

Sunday March the 17 1844

first part wind from NE of E
steered NNE weather employed in ships
middle part light breeze variable and calm
latter part wind from NE headed NNE
so ends Lat 41° 21' N
Long 165° 25' E

Monday March the 18 1844

first part wind light from NNE
headed NNE at 5 squally trade in ply
and foretopgallant sail middle part headed
NNE latter part strong breeze from NE steered NNE
saw a ship to leeward so ends Lat 41° 29' N
Long 164° 10' E

Tuesday March the 19 1844

first part wind from NE steered
NNE got down to within 2 miles of the ship
she saw 2 whales to leeward and lowered so we
she fastened and got two the organ of Fushaven
middle part got 9 the Capt. went on board at 10 came
back with the Carpenter of that ship and a stern post
part of the time on one task and part on the other
latter part at 6 sent the Cooper on board of
the organ in their Carpenter's room employed
mending the boat headed NNE under easy sail
saw pinbacks so ends Lat 41° 53' N
Long 161° 35' E

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Wednesday March the 20 1844

first part wind from NE with light
squalls and strong breeze under easy sail. Organ
abstem. Mending boat. Middle part squally and rain
wind variable headed N at 5 that ship here NE sailing
wind came out from SW with heavy rain steered NE
of E latter part light breeze and variable and heavy
rain steered NE under easy sail so ends Lat 41° 31' N
Long 161° 31' E

Thursday March the 21 1844

first part light air and variable from
the Westward steered NNE under easy sail light rain
and thick did not see the other ship. Middle part
headed NNE wind variable latter part strong breeze
from NE of E headed NNE employed repairing
the boat nothing in sight so ends Lat 41° 18' N
Long 163° 00' E

Friday March the 22 1844

first part strong breeze from NE
headed NNE employed mending boat. have lost
the organ at 5 took in topgallant sails and
flying jibs. Middle part squally with short
sail headed NNE latter part strong breeze from
NE and sailing all sail out until 11 squally and
the topgallant and saw straits. Island bearing E. Masque
or Kanaker side so ends Lat 41° 12' N
Long 162° 35' E

Saturday March the 23 1844

first part strong breeze from NE
steered NNE repairing boat saw a pinback
at 9 lost sight of the land 4 points on the
weather quarter. Middle part steered NNE wind
strong from ENE all sail out latter part the
sails finished the boat sewing fore topgallant sail
so ends Lat 41° 4' N
Long 161° 50' E

Sunday March the 24 1844

first part squally wind
from NE steered N bent foretopgallant sail. Middle
part strong breeze from NE to E steered N until 3 then
steered E by N latter part heavy rain and light variable
wind from NNE to E steered E by N so ends
Lat 41° 16' N
Long 160° 25' E
