

Remarks on board ship Martha Faus Haven April 10 1844
Wednesday April the 10 1844

first part rain air blowing strong at 11 let go the other anchor latter part got off 13 casks of water &c so ends

Thursday April the 11 1844
first part hung up the Lark can anchor sent down tackle & caught one of the Kanakas latter part at daylight have shot on got under weigh brought up another Kanaka shipped 5 white men at 4 ischages the pilot capt went on shore after another from heavy rain and strong gales unloosed the chains so ends

Friday April the 12 1844

first part strong breeze and rain wind from S.E. lashing off and on at sunset the Capt. & crew squandered away and steered N.W. under easy sail latter part good weather wind from E.N.E. heaved N. made sail so ends land in sight Lat 11° 30' N

Saturday April the 13 1844

first part wind from E.N.E. heaved N. land in sight off the lee beam sent down the Miners to get the Mast and main sayal yards and sent in to fly the boom. Middle part strong breeze from N.E. heaved N.W. latter part at 4 found a strong man on board tacken ship to carry him back again heaved N.E. & so ends Lat 11° 10' N Long Chron 154° 50' E

Sunday April the 14 1844

first part strong breeze from N.E. & heaved N.E. & until 4 then tacked to the N.W. Middle part heaved N.W. latter part the same good weather so ends Lat 11° 10' N Long Chron 154° 18' E

Remarks on board ship Martha Faus Haven April 15 1844
Monday April the 15 1844

first part wind from N.E. & steered N.W. Middle part strong breeze from E. & latter part the same watch employed in ship duty so ends Lat 11° 10' N Long Chron 155° 50' E

Tuesday April the 16 1844

first part wind from N.E. & heaved N.W. Middle part strong breeze latter part the same watch employed in ship duty so ends Lat 11° 10' N Long Chron 156° 35' E

Wednesday April the 17 1844

first part strong breeze from E.N.E. heaved N. Middle part at 11 heaved N.E. & heaved N.W. latter part heaved N. repairing Main topsail with the watch so ends Lat 11° 40' N Long Chron 156° 25' E

Thursday April the 18 1844

first part wind from E.N.E. heaved N. at 5 heaved Main topsail Middle part more moderate latter part light breeze employed mending spunkies so ends Lat 11° 50' N Long Chron 156° 15' E

Friday April the 19 1844

first part light breeze from E.N.E. heaved N. watch employed in ship duty Middle part wind from E. & heaved N.E. & latter part wind strong breeze from E. heaved N.W. & watch employed in ship duty so ends Lat 11° 50' N Long Chron 156° 31' E

Saturday April the 20 1844

first part strong breeze from E. & heaved N.W. Middle part the same latter part wind from E. & heaved N.E. so ends Lat 11° 18' N Long Chron 157° 50' E

Sunday April the 21 1844

first part wind from E.N.E. heaved N. Middle part the same latter part wind fresh from E. & N. steered N.W. so ends Lat 11° 50' N Long Chron 158° 50' E
