

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven April 20 1844

Monday April the 22 1844

E.N.E. steering first part strong breeze from
N.W. Middle part the same latter
part the same so ends Lat 42° 0' N
Long 154° 25' E

Tuesday April the 23 1844
first part wind from E steered N.E.
saw blackish water engaged in ships
with Middle part steered N.E. wind from E.N.E.
latter part the same so ends Lat 42° 38' N
Long 154° 14' E

Wednesday April the 24 1844
first part wind from N.E. & E
steered N.E. or saw blackish and fragments
- so Middle part strong breeze and a heavy swell
took in the main top gallant sail headed
N.E. or so ends Lat 42° 08' N
Long 154° 12' E

Thursday April the 25 1844
first part strong breeze from
E.N.E. headed N. sent down the fore top gallant
- out of yard and sayaboard. Middle part
strong breeze might seeper top sails headed N.E. or
latter part the same sent down fore top gallant
sail so ends Lat 42° 15' N
Long 154° 25' E

Friday April the 26 1844
first part strong breeze from
N.E. headed N.W. bent a new fore top mast
strong sail double reefed top sails with the part
the same latter part sent down the main
royal yard so ends Lat 42° 11' N
Long 155° 52' E

Saturday April the 27 1844
first part strong breeze from
E.N.E. steered N.E. or Middle part wind moderate
- and veered to E. & E. latter part wind from
S.E. steered N. Made sail some repairs
so ends Lat 42° 29' N
Long 156° 01' E

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven May 1 1844

Sunday April 28 1844

first part wind from S.E. and good
weather steered N.E. at sundown shortened sail
and hauled to the Eastward. Middle part lay hove
to at daylight Made sail and steered N.E. at 8 saw
a whale going quick to windward lower the waist
hauled N. got hauled shortened sail and hauled
E.N.E. by the wind so ends Lat 40° 15' N
Long 155° 55' E

Monday April the 29 1844
first part wind from S. headed
E.N.E. at night shortened sail Middle part lay too
latter part at 6 saw a whale light fog and squall at
4 lowered two boats portened with the Larboard
boat at 11 part 10 took him along side at 11
began to cut bow choplin saw good Lat 30° 14' N

Tuesday April the 30 1844
first part cutting at 8 finished
at 4 saw a pair of whales wind light and
from N. saw rugged Middle part wind variable
and foggy at 3 began to hail latter part at 6 saw
a whale came on to rain and part sun of them
bailing so ends Lat 30° 10' N
Long 154° 14' E

Wednesday May the 1 1844
first part light breeze from
S.E. headed E.N.E. bailing at 4 saw a whale lowered
but could not get on Middle part headed S.
or laying aback latter part light breeze from
S.E. headed S.W. watch bailing at 10 had a
light squall of rain so ends Lat 30° 4' N

Thursday May the 2 1844
first part good weather light breeze
from S.E. headed S.W. at 6 saw a whale but
to late to lower Middle part lay aback latter
headed N. wind from E. gone bailing saw fin backs
so ends Lat 30° 11' N
Long 154° 11' E
