

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven June 2d 1844

Tuesday June the 4 1844

first part strong breeze from
SE & E and sails headed NE by E under double
seers sent all hands below officers and all
and I have to stand it all alone and there
is no look out for the ship. Middle part
light air and calm latter part light breeze from
NE and foggy headed NW making points for the
main topsail so ends Lat 48° 48' N

Wednesday June the 5 - 1844

first part light air from
NE and foggy headed SE at 4 sent down the
main topsail and pointed it and bent it again
at night double seers the topsails middle part
the same latter part foggy under all sail saw a
grampus so ends Lat 48° 48' N
Long 64° 35' W

Thursday June the 6 1844

first part light breeze from
NE headed SE & E foggy under the main
topsail middle part headed NE & E under double
seers latter part headed NE strong breeze at
10 took it in again foggy so ends Lat 48° 48' N

Friday June the 7 1844

first part strong breeze from
N headed NE & E foggy under double seers the men
foreward went to their meat weighed out a pound
and a quarter at night shortened sail middle
part headed E by N to latter part light breeze
from NW headed NW clear so ends Lat 48° 48' N

Saturday June the 8 1844

first part light breeze from NNE
headed NE foggy by spells middle part thick
fog latter part strong breeze from E by N NW
thick fog so ends Lat 48° 49' N

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fairhaven June 9d 1844

Sunday June the 9 1844

first part light wind from SE steered
NW by N thick fog but I wore the ship to the NW
middle part headed NW thick fog latter part
light rain at 9 saw 3 whales lowered and fastened and
hoisted the iron straps and lost the iron and 3 whales
saw no sail so ends Lat 48° 50' N

Monday June the 10 1844

first part light breeze from SE
and foggy headed SE at 4 sent one boat for
a whale close to the ship in not strike
middle part foggy latter part at 8 lighter up
saw 3 whales lowered and sunk one lost 4 men
and 3 lances and about 40 parthons of line saw
a bark to windward so ends Lat 48° 45' N

Long 64° 28' W

Tuesday June the 11 1844

first part light breeze from
N headed NW at 3 saw 3 whales dropped two
boats first boat fastened got stone 3 whale
sign to windward with a loose one set the
loose one spouting head and shee got foul
of the line and disavowed the iron from the
first one lost them both lost 2 guns and one
lance middle part headed NW latter part head
wind from SE foggy read the name of the bark
framing of slaves employed repairing the boat
so ends Lat 48° 50' N

Wednesday June the 12 1844

first part light breeze from
E headed NW under short sail light rain lowered
in chase of 3 whales but in not fasten at night
shortened sail middle part headed NW latter
part the same rain and foggy employed in repara-
-ing boat so ends Lat 48° 49' N
