

Remarks on board Ship Maestee Fairhaven Sept 1844

Monday Sept the 2 1844

first part light airs and calm
began down all the afternoon fastened to 4 ft
open from aft blowing Middle part light airs
latter part light breeze from S of chasing whales
and hauling so ends Lat 0° 42' 12" N

Tuesday Sept the 3 1844

first part light airs, pasted
up drew Maestee part heavy in very light airs
latter part boat down all the time fastened
to 3 out from one side from one and broke the
iron in another myself and three boats sick not
in the boats on board hauling 30 miles from land
Lat 0° 52' 34" N

Wednesday Sept the 4 1844

first part light airs from NNE
headed to the E with calms lowering once Middle part
light airs and calms latter part breeze from NNE came
on and got him along side at 11 30 ends
Lat 0° 52' 36" N

Thursday Sept the 5 1844

first part strong breeze from
NE cutting spoke the Rosalie of Warren got
2 long hances and let her have some planks
at 11 finished cutting and shortened said planks
part strong breeze from NNE headed off
shore latter part good weather hauling hauler
in shore so ends Lat 0° 52' 20" N

Friday Sept the 6 1844

first part light breeze from
NE and good weather headed NNE finishing
Rosalie in company Middle part headed off
half the time latter part light breeze from
SE headed N saw the land at 9 began
to rain hauling 30 ends Lat 0° 52' 30" N

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Saturday Sept the 7 1844

first part strong wind fresh from
NE headed off at 2 ended down at 5 began to
hoist again Middle part Middle part breeze later
part cooler down strong gales 50 ends
Lat 0° 52' 20" N

Sunday Sept the 8 1844

first part strong and strong
gales from NE headed off at 2 ended down at 5 began to
hoist again Middle part Middle part breeze later
part fine weather and light breeze from
NW hauling the Capt. sick 50 ends Lat 0° 52' 20" N

Monday Sept the 9 1844

first part light breeze from
S of wind NE under short sail began to
stop down in the after hold at night finished
hauling spoke the Hanny of House bound in
to St. Peters agreed to run in in company
Maestee said and steered N through the
night latter part light breeze from N
ran N of 1/2 in fore the land employed
stowing down bent chains so ends

Tuesday Sept the 10 1844

first part light breeze from
S steering in for the bay employed stowing
at 8 came to an anchor 3 miles in
side of the mouth of the bay when
Middle part light breeze latter part wind from N
until 10 steaming at 10 got under weigh at 11 light
air struck up the bay in getting our anchor exposed
the wind lags so ends

Wednesday Sept the 11 1844 light breeze from SE
at 3 came to an anchor into St. Peters latter part
stowing down 30 ends

Thursday Sept the 12 1844 first part broke out water
in the fore hold and soaked it out to keep her latter part
one watch on liberty hauled round the stern so ends
