

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fishawen Sept. 20 1844

Sunday Sept. the 29 1844
first part watches one liberty latter part the same so ends

Monday Sept. the 30 1844
first part wind strong from E let go the other anchor Smith's part strong gales latter part the same so ends

Tuesday Sept. the 1 1844
first part More moderate light rain Middle part rain strong Men recently Henry Smith and Joseph Rodgers latter part at 6 have up the Larboard anchor and have in upon the starboard chain so ends

Wednesday Oct. the 2 1844
first part light breeze and rain brought 3 barrels of herrings and pickled them Smith's part rain strong Smith came back again latter part light air and rain so ends

Thursday Oct. the 3 1844
first part light air and rain Smith's part latter part light air from SE and calm so ends

Friday Oct. the 4 1844
first part calm and light rain got a boat load of wood latter part the same got off 5 cask of water so ends

Saturday Oct. 5 1844
first part calm and light air got off a boat load of wood latter part heavy rain let go the other anchor so ends

Sunday Oct. the 6 1844
first part More moderate breeze up the Larboard anchor latter part rain strong breeze from SE so ends

Remarks On board Ship Martha Fishawen Oct. 1844

Monday Oct. the 7 1844
first part strong breeze from E and heavy rain at 5 let go the Larboard anchor latter part calm and light rain hove up and hove out further so ends

Tuesday Oct. the 8 1844
first part calm and rain latter part the same sent a boat to tow in a Russian big squid

Wednesday Oct. the 9 1844
first part rain and light air latter part the same so ends

Thursday Oct. the 10 1844
first part light air and variable and light rain latter part light breeze from NW at 8 got under weigh and 4 other ships at Meridian had got 4 Miles outside of the head saw two ships beating in so ends

Friday Oct. the 11 1844
first part light breeze from S E headed E stowed anchors at night 12 miles from the head Smith's part strong breeze from S E headed S E latter part strong rain so ends
Lat 43 51. 48 N

Saturday Oct. the 12 1844
first part strong gales from S E headed S E at 2 took in the Main top gallant sail and single reefed at 5 chase reefed took in Gibe and Main sail Middle part the same latter part More moderate shower one reef out of the top sails so ends
Lat 43 50. 00 N
Long Chron 162 29 19 E

Sunday Oct. the 13 1844
first part strong breeze from S E headed S E with a heavy sea Mr Lee Mose said Smith's part Middle part set the fore top mast steering sail and stowed E. S. E. so ends
Lat 43 49. 35 N
