

Sunday June 11th

begin with strong breezes from SSW to SW
heeling to the South and East at 5 Bell went to the
W & N under Double reef at 7 Bell pulled the
Main sail Middle part light breezes later
part light breezes 8 or 10 Ships in Sit at
11 still saw 1 Whale land for him but
could not strike Sat by 6h 143 40
Lat by 6h 55 45

Monday June 12th

begin with strong breezes from the
SSW heeling to the South East at 6 Bell back
to the West at 8 Bell doubled reef the Top
Sail hold up the breezes took in the gill
pulled the Main sail plenty of Sea all
around Middle part strong breezes at 10 Bell
hold Abak had till 12 still then lost for ever
None Ship to the SE plenty of Sea in Sit at
10 were to the West saw one Whale going quick
to wind did not leave for him Sat by 6h 55 40
Lon by 6h 142 25

Tuesday June 13th

begin light airs and calms 2 Ships
in Sit Middle part light breeze Steaming through
and along the Sea later part saw whales land
all four boats but with out success one chased
from 3 till 5 Bell at 6 Seamen are
tho there were nothing for us mid
Sat by 6h 55 40
Lon by 6h 142 07

Wednesday June 14th

begin with light breezes from the NE
Boats in chase of Whales but could not
get fast at night came on board with
the part had a look at 4 still saw 1
Whale board but could not get fast
No Sat by 6h
Lon by 6h 142 07

Thursday June 15th

begin strong breezes Middle No Sat by 6h
part foggy at 7 till up went in the boats in
to the Sea at 8 but thick fog at 9 the
boats returned at 10 saw 1 Whale board all
4 boats but no luck could not strike
Sat by 6h 55 40 Lon 142 17

Monday June 26

begin fine weather and light airs land 15 miles
of Sea 4 all hands employed in cutting 4 Bell finished
cutting and got ready for haying at 6 Bell commenced
haying the Washington of Sag Harbor run down and
Spoke us then the Master of Mistick Capt Tex
ter he head 7 Whales the other Nothing at 8 the
Lexington of Nantucket run down and Spoke
us I went on board of her the Master of
Nantucket run down and Capt Bayley came on
board of the Lexington Middle and later part
fine weather at 10 till 11 Spoke the rager of New
Bedford Nothing this season Capt Fisher
came on board

Tuesday June 27th

begin with light breezes and fine weather
land and Sea in Sit and 8 or 10 Ships none
doing any thing No Whales we employed in
haying Middle part fine weather at later
part strong breezes from the NE heeling
to the SSE under Double reef Top Sails empty
in haying

Wednesday June 28th

begin with light breezes and calms
employed in haying Middle and later part
much the same till it thick part of the time
at 11 still finished haying our whale made one
hundred
Sat by 6h 55 40
Lon by 6h 142 35

Thursday June 29th

begin with light airs several Ships
in Sit at 7 Bell then 1 Whale and 1 Ship
chasing him with 5 boats we board for him
but neither struck at 8 boats returned and
and we rose to the NE at 11 rose to the SE
Middle and later foggy employed in blanning
and scraping loam

Friday June 30

begin with light airs heeling from the land at
7 Bell land 5 miles of shore up 8 hoar Middle part
thick fog at 10 till night none in at 11 still women
breaking out the chain that ch to strain down till at 9
till the fog lifted up land 5 miles of 3 Ships at anchor
at 10 saw one we let our anchor go and led up our sails
