Begins with light belling
winds bears West had some rain at night
the Northernmost Sailing Island here
is 25 miles off Middle point Squaly too in the
light Sails winds from the West Ship
healing to the North had plenty of lightning
and some thunder later parts thick and
rainy winds from the East bears West

Remarks on Sunday April 8 1855

Begins with light breezes
from the East comes W by South all sail
out Middle point Squaly and
Squaly at 6 o'clock Spleet the Gilt at 6
Spleet the four and the three top Sails
and four sail Starving the Main on
bent all three and bent other
and bent another four sail heavy
runs with Squaly winds from East

Remarks on Monday April 9 1855

Begins with light and calm and plenty
of rain Middle and later parts much the same
employed in repairing the four top sail at 12
Mid day bent him

Rain with out begins with calms and
beating at night took light breeze from the
East Middle and parts calms and plenty of
rain

Begins with light and
from the North comes WSW at night calm
Middle calm later part light and
from the West heading SSW for in the
West South for repairs

Lat by Oh 22.40.7 Long 168.24.4

Remarks on Thursday April 12 1855

Begins with light and from
the West heading to the SSW all sail out on bent
the Main top sail for repairs bent another
Middle and later part Squaly winds from the
WSSW at 8 o'clock head of Squaly carried away the fore
top boom took in the pieces and Spleet it

Remarks on Friday April 13 1855

Begins with light
breezes from the West heading SSW at 2 o'clock
Yent down the four top sail for repairs
Middle part modest later part much the same
employed in fixing the foremast found it
rotten cut out the rot and set in pieces

Remarks on Saturday April 14 1855

Begins with light and from
the NW heading WSW all sail out Middle and
later parts light and calms the watch
employed in bending the fore top boom out and
repairing the Main top sail

Lat by Oh 20.51.4

Long by Oh 167.30.10

Remarks on Sunday April 15 1855

Begins with light and from
the North Ship heading W by S and West light and
and variable the watch employed Middle part
light and from the North and West set the Star
ing Sails came West

Lat by Oh 20.48.4

Long by Oh 168.30.10

Remarks on Monday April 16 1855

Begins with light breezes
from the NW Ship east head on of wind
Middle part modest breezes later into the
watch employed in Spleet Sails
