begins with light breezes and thick fog
more ship heeling N by E at 5 AM more
to the S.E. and hold A Back again still
thick fog Middle part till 10 AM then
the main yard stood up till 1 PM then
more in stood in till 3 PM then more
at 4 PM at 6 PM more in thick and
foggy at 10 AM more foggy more of shore
at 11 AM more in and made all sail it lifted
up a little stand N by E 1/2 E winds SW
Lat by Ch 49 44
Lon by Ch 15 40

begins with thick weather
winds from SSW coars N by E at 1 PM thick
fog could see nothing took in main royal
and fore and aft topsails the fore and
more ship heeling S.E. heeling S.E. thick
Middle part strong breezes from the South heeling
S.E. next the top sails thick and rainy took in
main sail and fore
No Lat by Ch 49 35
Lon by Ch 15 30

Remarks on Monday May 21st
begins with strong breezes
from SSW and SW under double reef at
1 PM lost next the fore and main topsails
hold up the fore sail Middle part moderate and
thick fog at 12 PM more in thick fog
Lat by Ch 49 30

Remarks on Tuesday May 22nd
begins with brisk breezes
from the SSW at 2 PM it lifted up a little more
all sail at 5 PM saw the land bearing N 35
miles off stand in till 7 PM it lifted
and took in light sails and double reef
more of heeling S.E. Middle part fresh Gale later
Sail at 1 PM more to the S.E. winds from the WSW
at 10 PM more to the West Lat by Ch 49 15
Lon by Ch 15 35

Remarks on Wednesday May 23rd
begins with fresh Gale from
the N.W. heeling to the West at 1 PM more to the WSW
Lat the main sail and fore at 2 PM took in the
fore sail Middle part fresh Gale from the WSW
later part calm Lat by Ch 49 24

Remarks on Thursday May 24th
begins with thick weather
and light winds from the S.E. stand in for the
land bears N 1/2 W part of the time foggy at
6 PM hold up the foreboard shrou bent
it Middle part light breezes and thick
steering in for the passage as near as we
could judg with a good look out at 7 PM all
it lifted up and we were all right in the pass
Lat by Ch 50 00
Lon by Ch 15 00

Remarks on Friday May 25th
begins fine weather
winds S.E. coars N.W. all sail out Middle part
later part much the same light winds and
foggy part out the fore mast No Lat by
No Lon by Ch 50 00

Remarks on Saturday May 26th
begins with light winds
from the South steering N.W. all sail out
the fore compasses in ship's party Middle and
later part fine weather at 10 PM saw Barge
