

Remarks on Friday July 20<sup>th</sup>  
 begins with fine weather  
 winds from the NE at the Boats in search of  
 Whales employed on Board in making Ship  
 later part took the Corken and beat to the East  
 at 11 till Capt Corken to boats came in. Sun was  
 shed for 32 hours

Remarks on Saturday July 21<sup>st</sup>  
 begins with fine weather 2 Boats  
 went on Shore and got some Wood at 6 AM  
 got the Ship under way and went down to the  
 East at 9 AM Drove Corken Middle part made later  
 part much the same sent 2 Boats to the Big Shanty  
 Bay to see if they could find any Whales the other  
 went the other way. Loggan Corken

Remarks on Sunday July 22<sup>nd</sup>  
 begins with fine weather at 11 AM  
 the Boats came on Board the other started at  
 3 AM sent the other the other way in search of  
 Whales at 10 AM 2 of the Corken Boats came  
 along side of the ship all night they had been gone  
 48 hours from the ship and then was 15 or 20  
 miles from her with a head tide. The tide on  
 current runs here in the Bay. 3 or 4 knots



Remarks on Monday July 23<sup>rd</sup>  
 begins with thick fog and moderate breeze  
 from the NE at 1 PM took up the Corken  
 and cleared it all 4 Boats at 3 PM 2 of them  
 found us at 4 the others came at 5 PM it hit  
 the Chime of New Bedford got a Whale at 7 PM  
 saw too on 3 Whales board 2 Boats but with no  
 success at 8 returned sent of the other 2 to  
 stay all night about 20 miles Middle part made  
 later part Drove at 4 PM some rain at 5 AM  
 sent of the other 2 Boats in search of Whales  
 the Corken Boats still gone

Remarks on Tuesday July 24<sup>th</sup>  
 light breeze from the NE and thick weather  
 Boats still at 4 miles later part Drove

Remarks on Wednesday July 25<sup>th</sup>  
 begins with light breeze from  
 the NE at 11 AM one Boat returned reported  
 they had seen a Whale 10 or 12 miles off in the  
 Ice got the Ship under way thick fog and heavy  
 rain at 11 PM Corken slid down the Sails and  
 sent them below at 3 AM it hit a little and  
 sent the Boat to help to still raining hard at 7  
 AM saw the 2 Boats but no Whales but the  
 current had carried them one side of the ship and one  
 of the Boats on board and had a light breeze  
 took over Corken and sent to the Whale at 9  
 got him to the Ship sent him got boats  
 fast and commenced butting at 12 AM finished

Remarks on Thursday July 26<sup>th</sup>  
 begins with thick weather and calms  
 at 4 AM other 2 Boats came on Board then gone  
 a night with out success Middle part later  
 part the 2 Boats still hang to Corken

Remarks on Friday July 27<sup>th</sup>  
 begins with light breeze from the NE lying at  
 Corken employed in Bayling sent 2 Boats in to the  
 land in search of Whales saw some could not  
 thick Middle and later thick at 5 PM sent all  
 4 Boats Ship keeps employed in Bayling

Remarks on Saturday July 28<sup>th</sup>  
 begins with brisk breeze from the East at  
 4 PM finished Bayling all 4 Boats in search  
 of Whales part of the time thick fog Middle part  
 heavy later part Drove constant rain saw 4 Ships  
 in sight to Corken
