

Ship Mary of Newbedford
Monday Aug 30 1852

Begins with a fresh breeze from NE
steering S W
Middle part heading to the S W morder
ate breeze from Eastward saw the Isle
of Carvo S W 25 miles distance
Latter part heading in for the island
at 12.16 it is 2 miles dist

Tuesday 31

Begins with a light air and calms at 2 P M
went on shore and engaged some potatoes
Law bark sea fox here recruiting 15 months
out 450 spirm potatoes 40 cts per bushel
onions 2 dols thousand pumpkins 10 cts a
piece eggs 10 per doz figs dear
fourts 20 cts a piece

Wednes September 1 1852

Begins with a moderate breeze from
Westward getting of potatoes onions & C
and paying for them at 4 P M got
through and steered to the southward
saw a number of sails got 2 boys at the
Island of Carvo to go for their food &
clothes
Middle & latter part flores island bore
to the S. W. E squally & rainy one sail
in sight

Thurs 2 Begins with a light breeze from Westward
steering S E stringing up pumpkins
onions & C

Middle part light air and calm steering
E S E wind N W with a heavy swell from NE
Latter part steering E S E Feegal in sight
saw one sail in sight Lat 28° 30' N

Ship Mary Newbedford

Friday 3 light breeze & heavy swell steering
E S E Middle & Latter part heading towards
the east side of the island at noon saw
the town a number of ships in sight

Satur 4 Went on shore to carry letters had
port charges to pay 128 got on board
at sunset & steered down the passage
betwene St George & Fico verry squally
latter part blowing a gale from W S W
heading to the S E under short sail

Sun 5th Begins with a strong breeze and
squally under last reefed Main
topsail & foresail by the wind to the
Southward Middle & latter part
squalls of rain & verry bad wether
Lat Obs 27° 09' N
Long chro 26° 20' W

Mon 6 Squalls of rain from East steering S E
one sail in sight
Middle part morderated some
latter part variable wind on Diferent
tocks saw the Island of St Marys
Lat Obs 26° 44' N
Long chro 25° 04' W

Tues 7th Begins with a moderate breeze from
Southwest to S E at 4 P M tacked the W S W
saw 1 bark and one Schooner
Middle part heading S W by the wind
at sunset St Marys bore East 20 miles off
Latter part squally saw a number
of sails John Hastings had a number
of fits took the hole water to hold him
