Tuesday Oct 5th 1852

Fresh breeze from NE steering S
all sail set Middle part steering S fresh
breeze Latter part fresh breeze NE broke
out some bread & flour & coopered it Joseph
Boyles sick give him 3 Emetic & Carpenter
much better

Lat Obs 12° 30' N

Long Chro 22° 19' W

Wednesday Begins with a fresh breeze from NE
& a strong current cooping bread & flour
salted the butter carpenter still growing
better Middle part steering S saw a sail
Latter part fresh breeze from NE

Lat Obs 10° 57' N

Long Chro 22° 01' W

Thursday Begins with a moderate breeze from E
steering south Latter part breeze from SW
some rain

The Latter part light trades winds and
Clear saw a sail standing to westward
The watch employed making spungarn
Carpenter much better Reper and
Boyles some better Lat by Obs 10° 05' North

Remarks on board Friday the 8th

The fore part light airs and clear weather
With all sail set saw a sail and black fish
Lowerd all boats and chased without success
The Middle part fair winds and light
The Latter part saw four sails and a finback
the watch employed fitting new fly gib
Sheets and making spungarn Carpenter
most well Boyles much better Reper
improving fast heat as before

from capverdes to the line

Saturday October 9th 1852

Courses Winds Light northerly air and clear weather
all these 24 hours saw two sails and
S N ~~fin~~ back the watch employed on ships
duty carpenter quite smart on duty
Boyles came on duty to day reper quite
smart day times and out of his head
Mights ship leak as before so ends
Lat Obs 8° 20' N

Courses Winds Sunday Oct 10th

Calm The fore part calm and clear saw two
sails

SE S W The middle part light breeze from
westward and squally with rain

S W The latter part fresh breeze from S W
at 9 am steered fore and mizen top

SE S W Gallant sails and fly gib saw four
sails Reper crazy through the night

Lat Obs 8° 07' N

Long Chro 21° 46' West

Courses Winds Remarks on board Monday Oct the 11th

SE S W The fore part fresh breeze from S S W
attended with rain squalls saw four sails

by the Wind The middle part wind light and squally
Made all sail reper had a crazy spell

The latter part light breeze and clear
weather the watch employed fitting

a fluke rope and making some
hole swabs and knotting yarns for

spungarn Matthew ryon put in irons
for quarreling leak as before so ends
