 Tuesday

S E SW The fore and middle part light airs  
 and calm the weather clear with all  
 sail set

The latter part light airs from SE  
 SE SW Saw three sails the watch employed  
 in sizing the mizen rigging and  
 knotting rope yards for spun yarn  
 S E SW Carpenter making new top for the  
 try works took rope out of stows  
 Proper better so ends Lat Obs 11-11 N  
 Long Chro 19-05 W

Wednesday Oct the 13th  
 SW SE The fore and middle part light airs  
 and calm saw blackfish roper  
 fore mast hand had fits and crazy  
 Every night the capt thought he  
 shamed then last night he had a  
 fit the capt came on deck and shout  
 him out of it the latter part he went  
 to work as well as he ever did the  
 latter part wind veered to SW tooked  
 ship to SE the watch employed  
 making spun yarn and finished sizing  
 of the mizen rigging Lat Obs 6-33 N  
 Long Chro 19-09 W

Thursday Oct the 14th  
 SE SW The fore part light airs the middle  
 squally attended with rain stowed  
 top gullnet sails and double ruffed  
 the top sails  
 SE SW The latter part made all sail The  
 weather thick and rainy saw a sail  
 W all hands well and on duty so ends

Lat Obs 6-17 N  
 Long Chro 18-50 W

from Cape Verde to the Line October 15th  
 Course Winds Friday Oct the 15th

SE SW The fore part squally and rainy weather  
 at 10 clock I saw blackfish lowered  
 blackfish all boats and chased struck on and  
 got him hove him in and striped the  
 blubber of him

The middle part strong breeze and  
 calm heavy rain stowed light sails  
 The latter part calm saw blackfish  
 light lowered without success the watch  
 employed minding the blubber and  
 making new main ropes for the  
 bow sprit Lat Obs 6-07 N  
 Long Chro 18-09 W

Saturday Oct the 16th  
 calm The fore part clear and calm saw the  
 three sails

S SW The middle part squally attended  
 with rain stowed light sails at 12 mid  
 night made all sail light airs  
 The latter part light airs and rain saw  
 blackfish lowered 2 boats with out  
 success the watch employed boiling the  
 blackfish blubber out all well  
 Saw one sail Lat Obs 5-44 N  
 Long Chro 17-45 W

Sunday Oct the 17th  
 SE SW The fore part fine breeze and steady  
 with all sail set  
 The middle part fresh breeze and squally  
 with rain stowed light sails  
 The latter part fine steady breeze made  
 all sail 2 sails in sight  
 Ship leak this day was 50 strokes

Lat Obs 4-44 N  
 Long Chro 17-50 W
