 top gallant sails so ends

Wednesday Oct the 20th
 Fresh winds and cloudy weather
 The watch employed ratin down the
 mizen & top mast shrouds and finished
 sizing of the main shrouds and
 making spuryarn saw porpoises
 set fore and mizen top gallant sails
 one sail in sight standing to SW
 ship leak this was 150 strokes
 Lat Obs 1-37 North
 Long Chro 18-47 West

Ship Mary on the Equinoctial line
 Thursday October 21th 1852
 Course Winds Fresh winds and clear weather all this
 day with all sail set
 1 WSW S the latter part exchanged signals
 off to With an American ship steering northward
 1 WSW NE The watch employed ratin down the
 main rigging and new sizing the fore
 shrouds and stowing some water
 forward to trim ship
 ship leak this day was 100 strokes
 Lat Obs 44 N
 Long Chro 19-40 W

Friday October the 22th
 Fresh trades winds and cloudy weather
 all this day with all sail set
 The watch employed ratin the main
 and in top mast rigging and finished
 sizing the fore shrouds saw four or five
 and plenty small fish
 ship this day was 50 strokes
 Lat by orb 00-03 south
 Long Chro 20-32 West

Saturday October the 23th
 Fresh trades winds and cloudy weather
 the middle part stowed light sails
 The watch employed on ship duty
 the fore part saw a hump back
 all hands well ship leak this day
 was 100 strokes Lat Obs 1-23
 Long Chro 22-02 W

Sunday Oct the 24th
 Fresh trades winds and cloudy weather
 and squally the fore and middle part
 With all sail set the latter part singled
 1 WSW NE Reefed the top sails and set top gallant
 sails over them a bark passed us bound
 toward ship leak 200 strokes
 Lat Obs 2-30 S
 Long Chro 22-34 W
