 double reefed top sails & stowed main sail
 The latter part made all sail a fine breeze

attended with fog squalls saw a number
 of fin backs the watch employed planking
 the Thindlis and hoisted out the starboard
 pump and found it rotten it was so
 bad it would not pump but verry little
 water set some pieces in it & put it in
 again Ship leak as before

 with all sail set saw a number of fin backs
 the middle part stowed top gallant sails
 and main sail

The latter part set main sail saw fin
