Sat 30 The fore part light breeze from N.E. steering W.N.W. & N.W. by W. Middle part calm Latter part fresh breeze from W. heading N.W. two sails in sight the weather cloudy and cold

Sun 31 A fresh breeze from W to S heading N.W. steering W.N.W. one sail in sight & some ice saw some finbacks

Mon 1 June A fresh breeze from S.E. & S steering W.N.W. one sail in sight at 5 P.M. made Jones Island spoke ship Walter Scott of Edgartown one whale Middle & latter parts strong breeze from S.E. & foggy on various tacks three sails in sight & some ice

Tues 2 A strong breeze from S to S.E. on different tacks three sails in sight Jones Island cold cloudy weather

Wed 3 A strong breeze from S.E. heading S.W. Jones Island in sight attended with a snow storm Middle & latter parts fresh breeze from N.E. & S steering to the southward along the ice one sail in sight

Middle part laced aback in company with the barn stable Capt Fisher at 7 P.M. carried the capt's wife & boy on board the barn stable at 9 fastened the hatches to smoke the mutineers out the capt asked them if they would go to their duty & they said they would go in irons & he flogged nine times a day first so we made a fire with charcoal & brimston at 11 they busted open the scuttle and said they wanted to come up so we let them out put 15 in irons & manueled the spanyard John the cook thearator Mc Lennet & sprat in the Rigging & flogged them & they said they would go to duty & so did all the rest

Thurs 28 A moderate breeze from N.W. to W.S.W. steering to the southward & Westward four sails in sight in company with the barn stable the mutineers all went to duty at 8 P.M. the capt brought his wife & boy on board Latter part light breeze employed setting up oil shooks

Fri 29 A light breeze from W.S.W. to N.W. on various tacks Latter part light breeze from E.N.E. steering W.N.W. two sails in sight employed setting up oil shooks some snow squalls
