

Sunday April the 26 1854

Sun 26 The fore part strong breeze  
from E steering N N W  
attended with hail & rain  
snow at 7 A.M. commenced  
a fresh gale from N E took  
in all sail down to close reefed  
Main top sail & fore top mast  
stay sail. Latter part moderated  
Made sail heading W N W  
Wind N the weather cloudy  
& cold so ends the day

Mon 27 A moderate breeze from N W  
took on different tacks some  
snow squalls saw fin backs  
& hellers & lots of birds

Tues 28 A strong breeze from N W to  
W heading N N E steering N  
by W & W saw some squalls

Wednes 29 A strong breeze from W to  
S W steering N N W by N W by  
N 1/2 N saw some drift wood

Thurs 30 A strong breeze from W to N N W  
Working to the northward and  
Westward - at 5 A.M. made  
the fourile Isles saw lots  
of fin backs & puffing figgs

Monday April the 20 1854

Mon 20 A fresh breeze from N N W to N W  
heading W N W employed at  
various jobs saw fin backs

Tues 21 A strong breeze from N E to  
S E steering N N W one sail  
in sight saw fin backs

Wednes 22 The fore part strong breeze from  
S E steering N N W saw fin backs  
Middle part blowing a heavy  
gale & rainy laying to under  
close reefed main top sail &  
fore top mast stay sail  
Latter part moderated & kept  
her off N N W saw porpoises

Thurs 23 The fore part fresh breeze  
from S steering N N W  
Middle part light breeze  
& frugged  
Latter part moderate gale  
from N N W heading W  
attended with rain

Fri 24 All these 24 hours blowing a  
heavy gale from N N W to W  
some hail squalls laying  
under close reef main top sail  
& fore top mast stay sail

Sat 25 The fore part fresh gale from  
N N W heading N Middle &  
Latter parts light breeze  
from S E steering N N W  
bent the fore stay sail
