

Ship Mary & Susan towards the North west

Coast after whales Gilbert Pendleton Commander

Monday These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the Southward steering west at 2 P M took the wine from the Southward at 10 P M came in heavy squalls double reef the topsails the wind S W rough and squally attended with small rain Middle hours strong gales and rough latter hours the wind abating and mostly clear saw 3 sails nothing worthy the storage being off duty yet

Lat Obs 56.16 South Long 67.18 West

Tuesday These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the S W heading N W by the wind at 2 P M made moderate made single reef topsails and main top gallant sails saw 5 ships at 5 P M saw a large ship which was for him spoke the Goleman British of New Bedford in company with the 3 boats the vessel had been along side of him the boatmen mistook the cause unknown the Goleman's boat struck and took him Middle hours moderate made whole topsails and main top gallant sails at daylight made the Smith Islands or passed Cape Horn bearing from S W to S 15 miles distant latter hours strong gales and squally stood off shore

Lat 56.15 South Long 67.36 West

Wednesday These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S W and squalls of rain and thick heading S W at 1 P M took to the S W saw 3 ships at 3 P M went to the S W hauled top gallant sails at 10 P M made single reef the topsails Middle hours strong winds and squally at 5 P M made fore and main top gallant sails and used ship heading N S W latter hours moderate made all sails at 10 P M made the Diego Ramirez Bearing S W 15 miles distant the Black Bay from off duty yet

Lat Obs 56.41 South Long 68.29 West

Thursday These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S W heading to the westward by the wind at 3 P M hauled fore & main top gallant sails and flying jib passed 10 miles to the Southward of the Diego at 6 P M made single reef the topsails and set the main top gallant sails at 7 P M took to the Southward made the Solene of Adafuso bearing S W 20 miles distant saw 3 ships Middle hours strong gales and squally and rough with double reef the topsails latter hours the gale increasing hauled the mainsail and jib rough and small rain

Lat by Det 57.20 South Long 67.50 West

Friday These 24 hours commenced with heavy gales from the westward heading to the S E under close reef topsails at 2 P M furled the foresails blowing heavy in squalls of rain and hail at 5 P M more moderate made the foresail and main spencer Middle hours strong gales and rough at 8 P M the fore sail parted blowing heavy furled the fore sail one main reef badly put by the wheel his Samuel Patrick below deck latter hours blowing heavy and rough

Lat by Det 58.05 South Long 68.45 West

Saturday These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the westward heading S E at 2 P M the wind hauled to the S W and blowing heavy in squalls hauled the fore and main topsails and hoisted up the boats made all secure for the night Middle hours heavy squalls of wind rain & hail and tremendous sea latter hours blowing heavy in squalls lay up south of S E saw 1 sail to the windward

Lat Obs 58.18 South Long 67.27 West

Sunday These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the S W heading to the westward at 3 P M the squalls abating set the main topsails close reef and the foresail at 4 P M the wind changed to the Southward went to the westward at 10 P M made double reef topsails Middle hours moderate made whole topsails the wind abating and mostly clear at 5 P M made all top gallant sails and flying jib latter hours strong winds and squally

Lat Obs 57.45 South Long 68.36 West

Monday These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the Southward and squally heading by the wind to the westward at 3 P M hauled main top gallant sail the wind variable saw one bark ahead a merchantman Middle hours strong winds and squally set the flying jib latter hours strong winds frequent squalls of rain and hail cleared the flying jib and pulled out water from the main hatch
