March 5th rigging at 6 P.M. saw 2 schools of Spouting whales
1848. came up with them at dusk and not far from

strong trades

Monday These 24 hours commences with strong trades
and squally steering N.W. by compass the eye
March 6th but drove out of the end of the Main topgallant
1848. yard hauled in the staysail and repaired it
Variation 9. E. set the sail again, the wind S.E. Midale joins
the wind hauled eastward passing clouds latter
hours fresh trades and fine pleasant weather
employed overhauling rigging Henry came on duty

Tuesday These 24 hours commences with pleasant
weather fresh trades and passing trade wind
March 7th clouds steering N.W. by compass employed on
1848. rigging Midale hours moderate squalls it came
Variation 8. E. in squally and small rain latter hours fine
trades and pleasant weather employed on rigging
and cleaning ship out side

Wednesday These 24 hours commences with fresh trades
and fine pleasant weather steering N.W. by
March 8th compass employed cleaning ship and sitting for
1848. painting Midale hours light winds and passing
Variation 8. E. clouds latter hours light winds and squally
employed painting ship out side saw Blackfish

Thursday These 24 hours commences with light winds from
March 9th the N.E. steering N.W. employed painting ship out
1848. side at 1 P.M. took the wind from the Eastward
Variation 8. E. Midale hours light winds and mostly clear latter
hours fresh winds and clear pleasant weather the
wind variable and smooth

Lat 2.38 South Long 106.38 West

Friday These 24 hours commences with fresh trades
from the S.E. and mostly clear steering N.W. by
March 10th compass employed on various jobs of ship's duty
1848. Midale hours light winds inclining to calm and
Variation 8. E. smooth at 4 P.M. it came in squally in staysail
latter hours light winds filled 80 casks of water to lift
the ship and repair the copper

Lat 1.46 South Long 107.03 West

Saturday These 24 hours commences with light winds from
March 11th the N.E. and clear pleasant weather steering N.W.
1848. by the wind hauled up the wind to repair the copper
Variation 8. E. at 2 P.M. began to start the water and kept off N.W.
at 3 P.M. set Studdensails Midale hours light winds
and clear latter hours strong winds from S.E.
and pleasant employed sitting up rigging and
painting bulwarks

Lat 00.09 South Long 107.59 West

Sunday These 24 hours commences with fresh winds
from the Eastward steering N.W. employed on
March 12th no rigging and painting bulwarks Midale hours
1848. light air inclining to calm & clear pleasant
Variation 8. E. weather passing clouds latter hours pleasant scene
the wind light and variable
