Saturday These 24 hours commences with light air from the Northward and clear pleasant weather heading N by W by the wind employed on various jobs of ships duty the B. W. of the weather being Milder hours light winds and clear pleasant weather latter hours light air and calm launch'd 2 new boats took the old one in to paint and repair

Lat Obs 25.10 North Long 150.26 East

Sunday These 24 hours commences with light air and calm heading to the mercy of the waves employed filling the boats and other jobs of ships duty at 10 PM took the wind light from the Northward head to the N.W. & 9 PM the wind again to the Northward Milder hours light air and passing clouds latter hours light winds and fine pleasant weather observed the distance between the Sun and Moon

Monday These 24 hours commences with clear pleasant weather the wind from the Northward inclining Easterly heading N by W by the wind set up the main topgallant and Royal backstays spoke the B. W. Milder hours fine pleasant weather the wind from the Eastward heading N by W latter hours moderate pleasant weather set up the fore topmast and topgallant backstays observed the distance between the Sun & Moon

Tuesday These 24 hours commences with fine pleasant weather the wind from the Eastward steering N by W employed painting boats and other small jobs of ships duty spoke the B. W. and gave with her at 8 PM hauled up North wind & set stunsails Milder hours light winds and fine pleasant weather latter hours light winds and heading Milder employed on small jobs

Wednesday These 24 hours commences with light winds from the Northward hauled in stunsails and braced sharp by the wind unbutton the topgallant stunsails and stow them below sent the boats across spoke the Betsey Williams and gave light winds and passing clouds heading North by compass at the wind Milder hours light winds and pleasant latter hours the wind hauled out from the N.W. blowing strong hauled topgallant sails and flying jib

Lat Obs 29.01 North Long 148.22 East

Thursday These 24 hours commences with strong winds from N.W. heading to the N.W. by the wind straggled up the topsails employed on small jobs of ships duty at 10 PM the wind abating more for and main topgallant sails strong appearance of rain Milder hours wind moderate and steady latter hours clear of more whole topsails and topgallant sails unbutton the flying jib to repair and set the cutting pendant aloft employed repairing the flying jib

Friday These 24 hours commences with fresh winds from the N.W. heading N by W with all requisite sails set by the wind and hauled the main Royal yard and stow them there away but the flying jib and some other small jobs of ships duty thick cloudy and a strong appearance of rain and rain Milder hours fresh winds and mostly clear the wind inclining Easterly latter hours thick away set the topmast stunsails and flying jib wind N.W. employed on various jobs of ships duty

Lat Obs 33.53 North Long 146.57 East

Saturday These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering North employed stowing away spars and filling fore chutes at 7 PM hauled fore and main topgallant sails and jib & mainsail at 9 the main topgallant sail and double reef the main topsails Milder hours strong gales and rain double reef the main topsails and close reef the Milder came in thick the wind hauled to the Southward latter hours strong gales thick and rainy at 11 PM it came in equally calm the fore sails and hauled the main topsail
