May 24th
1848.

These 24 hours commences with fresh winds from the Northward heading by the wind to the N.E. at 1 P.M. set fore and main topgallant sails at 3 P.M. I came in thick the wind bearing and making sea low and at 7 P.M. took in sails heading west. Mialde knew the wind abating and thick fog at 5 P.M. made sail the fog cleared up latter hours fresh winds and passing clouds at the rigging filled with sea.

May 25th

These 24 hours commences with fresh winds from the Northward heading by the wind to the westward at 2 P.M. made the main topgallant sail and took in the N.E. at 4 P.M. saw 1 right whale going quickly to the Northward did not lose at 7 P.M. took in the topsails and carried it through the night. Mialde knew light winds and smooth at 4 P.M. made all sails and stood to the Northward latter hours calm repaired the fore topsail and unbutton the main sail and repaired it and ship to the N.W.

These 24 hours commences with light winds from N.E. and variable heading N.E. with all sail set by the wind but the mainsail and set at thick cloudy and smooth at 4 P.M. at 7 P.M. took in sails and, and set topsails at 9 P.M. came in fog. Mialde knew light winds and squalls of snow at 4 P.M. made all topsails heading N.W. latter hours thick fog and snow at 11 P.M. cleared off pleasant.

These 24 hours commences with fine pleasant weather the wind N.E. heading N.W. by the wind at 1 P.M. made all sails the wind light and smooth employed creeping barrels at 4 P.M. at 7 P.M. took in the topsails and run in quarter watches Mialde knew light winds and thick at 4 P.M. made sail and stood to the Northward latter hours fine pleasant weather and smooth.

These 24 hours commences with pleasant weather the wind from the westward steering N.W. at 3 P.M. the wind fresh headed topgallant sails and lying fore came over thick steady at 4 P.M. at 7 P.M. took in sails heading N.W. Mialde knew strong gales and rough at 7 P.M. made sail at 8 P.M. at 9 P.M. saw 1 right whale rough sea and low luff to and took in fore and main topsails latter hours strong gales and rough.

Lat 55.15 North Long 150.25 East

Monday
May 29th
1848.
Variation 3. E.
These 24 hours commences with strong gales from N.W. heading N.E. by the wind to the heading up N.W. at 7 P.M. took in the fore and main topsails the wind abating and fog coming. Mialde knew strong winds and squalls of snow and rain latter hours strong gales and rough laying to heading to the Northward.

These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.E. heading to the Northward at 1 P.M. the wind abating made sail and stood to the North at 2 P.M. and to the Southward saw whales chased and not killed at 8 P.M. took in sails heading N.E. Mialde knew light winds and smooth at daylight saw whales made sail lower studds and killed one at 7 P.M. took in sails and repaired for setting. latter hours an old sea and to the toward.

May 31st

Variation 3. E.
These 24 hours commences with fresh winds from the Northward finished cutting at 5 P.M. cleared up and took in sails heading N.W. set the watches and began to hoist smooth and cloudy Mialde knew light winds with rain, hail and snow began to melt latter hours the wind light and fog saw whales at 10 P.M. the fog cleared off made sail saw whales lower head ended not get hold came and bore.
