

Ship Mary & Susan towards the Sandwich Islands

Monday
November 6th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with strong trades and equally at 1 P.M. came down through the passage and a boat and shore. Main and Pilot 14 said of whaler in boat at 8 P.M. the wind dropped off and the anchor in 14 fathoms of water down up the side and set the water. Middle hours light winds latter hours the same several repetitions.

Tuesday
November 7th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with fine pleasant weather the wind from the Westward at 1 P.M. took the anchor and run down off the Kings Palace and came to in 23 fathoms of water. Middle hours light and passing clouds latter hours the same employed beating out in shore for shipping.

Wednesday
November 8th
1848.
Variation 10. E. These 24 hours commenced with fine pleasant weather the wind variable employed in fine weighing and storing 17 fathoms 28.5 fathoms several arrivals and departures. Middle hours light winds and passing clouds latter hours the same employed in ships duty beating out for smelting.

Thursday
November 9th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the N.E. employed smelting ship and getting up shore at sunset open the harbor fine good. Middle hours light, air latter hours the same took the water off just fine and

Friday
November 10th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds and passing clouds employed getting hold and small jobs of ships duty. Middle hours light winds and passing clouds latter hours moderate and watch in liberty in board beating out Provision.

Saturday
November 11th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds and passing clouds employed beating out and getting Provision at 6 P.M. the sailing men came on board. Middle hours light winds and passing clouds latter hours the same and watch in liberty and sailing Provision.

Sunday
November 12th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds and passing clouds employed beating Provision in shore the Liberty men all of them came along side several departures. Middle hours light winds latter hours the same the men in Liberty.

Monday
November 13th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds and fine pleasant weather and mostly clear the Liberty men all of them came along side of them by the name of James Smith came off and struck the blacksmith with a club twice. Last Providence party there and stop his face several times. Latter hours pleasant.

Tuesday
November 14th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds and fine pleasant weather all hands employed beating out the mizen mast and beating Provision and bread flour and Malasses in board for storage. Middle hours moderate latter hours strong trades and equally employed storing the Mizen mast with ground tier and Provision.

Wednesday
November 13th
1848.
Variation 13. E. These 24 hours commenced with strong trades and equally started the Lardner Anchor let go the Starboard jay out 23 fathoms and set up employed storing Provision and filling salt water. Middle hours strong winds and passing clouds latter hours moderate took the raft of water in board and set it down the mizen mast.

Thursday
November 14th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with moderate pleasant weather and strong trades took the raft and shore at 4 P.M. it came in strong trades took the Lardner anchor at 7 P.M. sent the boat in shore for the Skipper beating across the passage could not get through. Middle hours strong winds latter hours moderate took the raft of water in board and set it below decks.

Friday
November 15th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with strong winds and passing clouds employed storing water between decks and clearing decks getting up shells and beating from the shore. Middle hours light air and passing clouds latter hours the same and watch in Liberty.

Saturday
November 16th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with fresh trades and passing clouds at 7 P.M. the water came along side excepting some of them abusive put in the put out of the water about within a few names. Bunting, Patrick and James. Latter hours moderate pleasant weather and watch in liberty. Bunting Patrick came on board the starboard watch in liberty. Late 13 the fresh Pilot.

Sunday
November 17th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with fine pleasant weather fresh trades and passing clouds the Carpenter employed masting a big David. Middle hours strong trades and equally latter hours moderate pleasant weather and ships in the Tying.

Monday
November 18th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with moderate pleasant weather the trades strong and side and watch in liberty at 7 P.M. came along side. Middle hours light winds and passing clouds latter hours pleasant weather took in board 57 lbs of Potatoes.

Tuesday
November 19th
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with moderate pleasant weather the wind variable and passing clouds employed and various jobs of ships duty. Middle hours light winds and passing clouds latter hours the same ship and Moravian came on board.

Wednesday
November 20th
1848.
Variation 13. E. These 24 hours commenced with strong trades and light from all winds in the harbor at 2 P.M. took the anchor and stood out for the island of Oryza at 7 P.M. took the trades. Middle hours fresh winds and passing clouds latter hours the wind hauled out from the Northward and pleasant. Lat 19.55 North Long 156.50 West.

Thursday
November 21st
1848.
Variation 12. E. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the North heading to the Eastward by the wind at 4 P.M. took the wind from the S.W. lying 6 P.M. saw the island of Pagan having from N.W. to S.E. Middle hours entirely calm and thick cloudy latter hours the wind light from the Eastward and hauling Northward the land 15 distant.
