These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S.W. steering South thick snow with all sails out at 3 P.M. hauled Main topgallant sails and flying jib at 4.30 P.M. the main and fore topgallant sails at 6 P.M. took in sails and under thick snow and blowing strong Middle hours strong gales rain at 7 P.M. it came in equally hauled the foresails and closed up the main top sail and buff by the wind heading East latter hours strong gales from N.W. thick and rainy

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from N.W. E. veering to heading East saw 3 right whales blowing heavy and thick made all secured for the night Middle hours strong gales and equally at 7 P.M. kept off S.W. and set the fore sail latter hours strong gales rough and equally wind N.W. E.

E. thick cloudy and rough steering S.W. at 1.30 P.M. took in the foresails and hauled by the main heading East saw 1 whale laying too set the main spencer Middle hours strong gales and rough latter hours strong gales and mostly clear saw several whales rough and did not lose spoke the Mue of Grampat 6 whales

These 24 hours commences with light winds from the South and steering East saw 1 ship cutting at 4 P.M. it came in rain at 6.30 P.M. it came in thick took in sail heading S.W. the wind N.W. and smooth Middle hours light winds from S.W. and rain at 6 P.M. the rain abated made sail and kept off East latter hours strong winds from N.W.

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the West and steering East made the Island of Sado bearing S.W. 25 miles distant at 3 P.M. hauled by the wind to the North saw whales rough and did not lose spoke in sail heading N.W. Middle hours moderate moderate at 5 P.M. made sail and stood to the Southward latter hours pleasant took in sail

These 24 hours commences with pleasant weather wind from N.W. heading N.W. saw whales lower chas? could not get hold took in sail along side and hoisted and in in front at 9 P.M. set the water and ahead up sculls calms and smooth Middle hours calm began to bill latter hours pleasant the wind light from the Southward steering S.W. the Island of Sado bearing S.W. to South 15 miles distant by estimation employed sailing
