

Ship Mary & Susan towards the Ochotsk Sea

Saturday
May 26th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with strong gale from N.W. heading N.E. at 3 P.M. we made up the main topsails and sent the mizzen sail and got up the foremast of Sagharer before 22 months out 600 lbs at 6 p.m. the forecast and close up the fore and main topsails blowing heavy. Middle hours strong gale and rough latter hours more moderate made single up topsails fore and course the wind variable from N.W. to N.E. at 10 P.M. we made all sail steering N.W. by E. latter hours the wind came to N.W. and being hauled to foremast & sails and flying jib.

Sunday
May 27th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with strong gale from the N.W. and variable heading by the wind to N.E. & mostly clear and rough. Middle hours more moderate the wind N.W. made all sail steering N.W. by E. latter hours the wind came to N.W. and being hauled to foremast & sails and flying jib.

Monday
May 28th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with strong gale from the N.W. and thick clouds steering N.W. at 4 P.M. it came in thick and squally at 5.30 P.M. single up the topsails rough and fog. Middle hours more moderate made the main topsail and sail at 4 P.M. made all sail light squalls of snow the wind North latter hours light winds from N.W. heading E.

Tuesday
May 29th

Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the N.E. variable heading East. Light squalls of snow at 6 P.M. the wind light from N.W. heading N.E. by the wind. Middle hours light winds and thick fog. Latter hours strong winds from N.W. steering North saw several right whales thick fog and going did not lower at 11 P.M. clear off.

May 30th

Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S.W. variable steering North the wind hauling North at 2 P.M. hauled by the wind heading N.W. when N.W. and clear. Middle hours strong winds and rough hauled to foremast & sails and flying jib wind N.W. and old sea. Latter hours more moderate made fore and main topsails and sails.

May 31st
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from N.W. heading North by the wind employed repairing sails clear and old sea. Middle hours strong winds and clear. Latter hours the wind N.W. thick and squalls of light snow.

Friday
June 1st
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from N.W. heading N.E. with all sail out by the wind at 2 P.M. it came off sail several spouts at 5 P.M. thick fog. Middle hours strong winds and thick hauled main topsails and flying jib. Latter hours fine pleasant weather and clear made all sail again saw several spouts all going quiet.

Variations 4 E
These 24 hours commenced with pleasant weather and N.W. heading N.E. by the wind made the land bearing East 50 miles distant and old ship. Middle hours light winds from the N.W. heading N.W. by N. Latter hours the wind light from the N.E. steering N.W. by N. shifted the foreward quarter but saw the land bearing East light winds and pleasant.

Variations 4 E
These 24 hours commenced with pleasant weather & calm employed on various jobs of ship's duty at 2 P.M. took the wind from the Northward hauled by the wind heading N.W. N.W. clear and cold at 8 P.M. saw 2 right whales going Middle hours light winds and fog. Latter hours light and calm.

Monday
June 4th
1849.
Variations 4 E
These 24 hours commenced with calm and pleasant weather at 2 P.M. took the wind light from the Northward heading N.W. the wind N.W. saw 1 finback, thick cloudy. Middle hours light winds and hauling East by tack to the N.W. at 4 P.M. it came in thick fog. Latter hours pleasant.

June 5th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with fine pleasant weather the wind from the Northward heading to the N.E. at 1 P.M. saw 2 ships and of them whaling clear and smooth & c. Middle hours fresh winds and cloudy at 7 P.M. tack to the Westward. Latter hours light winds and calm. Middle sea.

Wednesday
June 6th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the Northward heading by the wind N.W. at 6 P.M. it came in thick fog at 8 P.M. in sail heading N.W. Middle hours fresh winds and thick fog at 7 P.M. made the topsails lay aback. Latter hours from N.W. to E. variable thick fog & mauling. Red.

Thursday
June 7th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with fresh winds from the N.E. variable heading N.W. braced jibs at 4 P.M. the fog broke at 8 P.M. took in sail word to the Southward. Middle hours the wind abated and fog cleared off pleasant at daylight made sail saw whale lower struck the line passed. Latter hours the wind light from the Northward saw a plenty of whales and Red.

Friday
June 8th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with pleasant weather the wind from the N.W. run off to the Eastward saw no ship and Red from 5 P.M. North as far East and Red as the eye could extend from the mast head. Red Red and detached pieces saw 1 whale lower down to the westward clear and old sea heaving from the N.E. took in sail heading N.W. spoke the Whaler of Wased looking at 8.30 P.M. made sail saw whales lower struck and killed her at 10 P.M. took her along side and prepared for cutting. Latter hours fine pleasant weather saw 2 ships.

Saturday
June 9th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with fine pleasant weather the wind N.W. at 1 P.M. hauled and began to cut saw 4 ships 2 of them taller whales found cutting at 7 P.M. at the water cleared away the head and began to cut light winds and thick cloudy carried whale topsails to the Southward and made. Middle hours light winds and to the Northward. Latter hours squalls of fog saw several whales going quickly to the westward.

Sunday
June 10th
1849.
Variations 3 E
These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the N.W. heading N.W. saw whale going quickly to the N.W. lower and employed. Middle hours light winds and variable at 7 P.M. thick fog. Latter hours clear off saw 2 whales lower and saw 6 ships. Latter hours light winds and smooth. Lat 57.30 North Long 151.55 East
