

Ship Mary & Susan Homeward bound

Sunday 11th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. variable heading S by the wind at 3 P.M. began to blow hard. Mizen topgallant sails and 14mg jib made all sail. Latter hours light winds and pleasant weather. Lat 15.55 South Long 156.06 West.

Monday 12th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the Northward steering S by E and all sail out at 6 P.M. the wind N.W. and light. Mizen hours light air and variable with sun and lightning. Latter hours the wind S.E. heading S by E. Patriotic off duty with rain. Lat 16.34 South Long 156.10 West.

Tuesday 13th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. and passing clouds heading S by E by the wind. Mizen hours light air and pleasant weather. Latter hours the wind S.E. heading S by E. Patriotic off duty with rain. Lat 17.33 South Long 156.16 West.

Wednesday 14th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with fine pleasant weather. The wind East heading S.E. by the wind passing clouds. Mizen and Latter hours fine pleasant weather with S.E. wind. Lat 19.03 South Long 156.20 West.

Thursday 15th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. heading South by the wind employed and ships out. Mizen hours fine winds and passing clouds at 5 P.M. made Perry's Island 15 miles. Latter hours pleasant weather. Lat 20.20 South Long 157.16 West.

Friday 16th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with fresh winds from the S.E. heading S.W. all sail out by the wind at 5 P.M. Mizen hours fresh winds and passing clouds at 5 P.M. made Mangia leaving S.E. 15 miles distant. Latter hours fine pleasant weather wind S.E. heading South. Lat 21.43 South Long 158.14 West.

Saturday 17th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced pleasant wind S.E. heading South by the wind all sail out and our ship heading South by the wind. Latter hours the wind S.E. heading South by the wind. Latter hours the wind S.E. heading South by the wind. Lat 23.53 South Long 159.50 West.

Sunday 18th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. variable heading S.E. by S at 3 P.M. began to blow hard. Mizen topgallant sails and 14mg jib made all sail. Latter hours light winds and pleasant weather. Lat 24.35 South Long 159.22 West.

Monday 19th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S.E. and cloudy steering S.E. and double and sea and a westerly current. Mizen hours fresh winds and cloudy. Latter hours the wind North and thick cloudy. Lat 26.10 South Long 156.17 West.

Tuesday 20th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. heading South by the wind at 6 P.M. the wind N.E. and light and up east stays. Latter hours the wind N.E. heading South by the wind. Lat 27.02 South Long 155.27 West.

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Wednesday 21st Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. steering S.E. all sail thick cloudy and sea and sea heading from the Westward. Mizen hours light air and variable. Latter hours the wind employed setting up rigging. Lat 27.37 South Long 154.57 West.

Thursday 22nd Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. variable steering S.E. and all sail out at 6 P.M. the wind N.W. thick cloudy and smooth. Mizen hours light air and equally Latter hours the wind light from the S.E. heading South. Lat 27.50 South Long 154.53 West.

Friday 23rd Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. variable heading S.E. by the wind all sail out. Mizen and main colors got stuck by a block at 6 wind S.E. by the wind passing clouds. Mizen hours strong winds and passing clouds. Latter hours equally heading South. Lat 29.27 South Long 154.56 West.

Saturday 24th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the Eastward heading S.E. at 1 P.M. double up the topsails and main colors. Mizen hours strong gales rough and equally Latter hours the wind heading S.E. Lat 30.40 South Long 154.56 West.

Sunday 25th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the Eastward heading S.E. by the wind rough and equally. Mizen hours strong gales and equally Latter hours the wind heading S.E. Lat 31.29 South Long 155.35 West.

Monday 26th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the Eastward heading S.E. by the wind rough and equally. Mizen hours strong gales and equally Latter hours the wind heading S.E. Lat 33.02 South Long 156.14 West.

Tuesday 27th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with strong gales from the Eastward heading S.E. by the wind rough and equally. Mizen hours strong gales and equally Latter hours the wind heading S.E. Lat 34.07 South Long 157.05 West.

Wednesday 28th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the Eastward heading S.E. by the wind rough and equally. Mizen hours strong winds and equally Latter hours the wind heading S.E. Lat 35.19 South Long 157.56 West.

Thursday 29th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. variable heading S.E. all sail out by the wind. Mizen hours light winds. Latter hours the wind light from the S.E. heading South. Lat 35.40 South Long 157.30 West.

Friday 30th Nov 1849. These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.E. variable heading S.E. at 3 P.M. the wind N.W. thick cloudy. Mizen hours the wind variable and light equally of rain steering S.E. Latter hours the wind steady from the N.W. thick cloudy. Lat 37.08 South Long 155.42 West.
