

Bark Mary & Susan, Atlantic Ocean, toward Cape Horn.

Remarks Tuesday Oct 23rd 1877.

Begins with light winds and squalls, from E & E
to South. Set five sails. Most of the light sails furled.
Middle and latter part Calm. Eleven sails in sight.
Set up the fore Mast back stay and rigging.

Lat 8-44 Long 25-24

Remarks Wednesday Oct 24th.

Begins with light air from the N. at 3 P.M. a light
breeze sprang up from N.E. Course S.E. at 8 P.M.
wind E.N.E. Course S by E. 8 sails in sight. Latter
part baffling and rainy. Lat 7-18 Long 24-41

Remarks Thursday Oct 25th

Begins with light air and calms. 11 sails in sight.
Middle part light air. Latter part Calms.
Employed setting rigging. 10 sails in sight.

Lat 6-58 Long 24-45

Remarks Friday Oct 26th.

Begins with light air and Calms. 10 sails
in sight. Latter part light air and baffling from
S.W. to S.E. 15 sails in sight.

Lat 6-54 Long 24-32

Remarks Saturday Oct 27th

Begins with light breeze from S.W. heading
by to the S.E. 9 sails in sight. Middle part Calm.
Latter part rainy. At 9 A.M. took quite a smart
squall from S.E., at 11 Calm.

Lat 6-38 no Obs.

Remarks Sunday Oct 28th

Begins with Calms. 16 sails in sight.
Middle part Calms. Latter light breeze
from the Eastward Course S. 5 sails in sight.

Lat 6-32 Long 23-32

Remarks Monday Oct 29th

Begins with a light breeze from E by S.
Course S. 5 sails in sight. Middle part
windy wind from S.E. heading by to the
S.W. Latter part baffling and squally.
with Calms between.

Lat 5-23

Bark Mary & Susan Pacific Ocean, toward Cape Horn.

Remarks Tuesday Oct 30th 1877

Begins with light air and squalls of wind
and rain. Calm between squalls. Hard work
to get to the South. One sail about three miles
from us trying same as we are. Middle part light
air and Calm. Lat part took a light breeze from E.N.E.
Course S by E.

Lat 5-08 Long 24-08

Remarks Wednesday Oct 31st

Begins with light air from E. Course S by W.
One sail in company. 5 in sight. It is awful hot
here. Middle and latter part moderate. at 10 A.M.
wind hauled to the S.E. 14 sails in sight, but
we are out sailing all of them.

Lat 4-20 Long 24-26

Remarks Thursday Nov 1st

Begins with moderate breeze from S.
I think it is the beginning of the S.E.
trader. 4 of the sails have gone out of sight
astern. Latter part fresh breeze from S.
heading by to the S.W. One sail in sight. all the
gone astern. and that fast going out of sight.

Lat 3-00 Long no Obs.

Remarks Friday Nov 2nd

Begins with fresh breeze from S. and squally.
heading by to the Eastward. Latter part fresh
breeze from S.E. heading by to the S.W. two
sails in sight going as we are. But we are
passing them as we have all others.

Lat 1-42 Long 28-01

Remarks Saturday Nov 3rd

Begins with moderate breeze from S.E. to
S.W. at 3 1/2 put off to pass a rock or
shoal marked on the Chart. It says a Russian
and an American ship, struck on it in
1860. at 4 A.M. we passed the line in Long
28-30. Latter part fresh breeze from E.S.E.
One sail in sight.
