

Bark Mary & Susan, Atlantic Ocean, toward Cape Horn.

Remarks Sunday Nov 4th 1877

Begins with moderate trades from S E by E, heading by N to the South. The Bark still in sight. She is the first sail we have seen that sailed with us. But she has three stay sails, and two masts more than we have. Middle part moderate trades. Latter part fresh trades. two sails in sight.

Lat 3-11 Long 27-09

Remarks Monday Nov 5th

Begins with fresh trades from S E by E. Course S W. all sail set. four sails in sight going as we are. Middle and latter part fresh trades.

Lat 6-14 Long 30-06

Remarks Tuesday Nov 6th

Begins with fresh trades. Employed overhauling cutting block straps. found one stranded. made one out of 2 parts of tow line. I expect the other strap is as bad. What is known fitting. Everything poor and nothing to repair with. Latter part fresh trades.

Lat 9-01 Long 30-45

Remarks Wednesday Nov 7th

Begins with light trades from S E. Course S W by S. Latter part moderate trades. two sails in sight.

Lat 11-31 Long 31-50

Remarks Thursday Nov 8th

Begins with moderate trades. Course S W by S. 5 sails in sight heading to the Southward. Latter part a little squally. Employed cooping provisions and arranging the hold. two whalers in sight.

Lat 13-59 Long 32-46

Remarks Friday Nov 9th

Begins with light trades. Course S W by S. at 2 P.M. spoke the Bark Matilda Sears. Nothing since saw her before. Latter part moderate. Still fitting the hold and cooping.

Lat 16-46

Bark Mary & Susan, Atlantic Ocean, toward Cape Horn.

Remarks Saturday Nov 10th 1877

Begins with light trades. The Matilda Sears and Arnolda still in sight. all hands employed cooping provisions, and pumping fresh water out of the ground tier, and filling it with salt water. Latter part moderate. finished the provisions. three sails in sight.

Lat 16-46 Long 34-12

Remarks Sunday Nov 11th

Begins with light trades. Course S W. four sails in sight. Steering to the S W. Latter part light airs and squalls. The Arnolda close by astern.

Lat 17-34 Long 34-59

Remarks Monday Nov 12th

Begins with light airs and squalls from S E to N E. heading S. Latter part fresh breeze from E to N E. Course S W.

Lat 19-05 Long 35-21

Remarks Tuesday Nov 13th

Begins with light breeze from N E. Several sails in sight. The Matilda Sears astern. Latter part moderate. Course S W by S.

Lat 21-05 Long 36-18

Remarks Wednesday Nov 14th

Begins with light breeze from N E by E. Course S W by S. The Matilda and Arnolda in sight. Latter part strong winds from N E by N.

Lat 23-30 Long 37-37

Remarks Thursday Nov 15th

Begins with strong wind from N E by N. Course S W by S. Middle part wind slowly hauling to the westward. Latter part wind S W and squally heavy rain. No observation.

Remarks Friday Nov 16th

Begins with strong winds from S W. heading by N to the Southward under Gaffs and Curds. Latter part moderate breeze from S. at 8 A.M. were ship to the westward.

Lat 26-44 Long 40-40
