

Bark Mary & Susan, bound farther North,
Remarks Friday January 4th 1878

Began with strong winds from the N.W. and a
bad irregular sea. Work under double reefed
sails and main sail. We have carried sail very hard
to day. I want to get away from here. But the
wind is so that we cannot get to the North without
going too near the land. We left the bounding
billow out of sight off our lee quarter.

Bar 29.6¹⁰⁰ Latter part strong winds from N.W.
Lat 34-04 Long 77-55

Remarks Saturday Jan 5th.

Began with strong winds from N.W. and increasing.
Under double reefed and bare sail. At 6 P.M. furled
the fore sail and close reefed the top sail, heading
by to the W. all appearances of a gale. Barometer 29.45¹⁰⁰
Middle part a gale with heavy squalls. Under close reefed
main top sail and stay sails. Latter part moderate
and hauled to the W.N.W. at 10 were ship to the N.
Barometer 29.3¹⁰⁰.

Lat 34-14 Long 78-30

Remarks Sunday Jan 6th

Began with fresh breezes from W.N.W.
Heading N under double reefed and courses jib
and spanker. Barometer 29.4¹⁰⁰. Middle part
wind N.W. at 3 P.M. wind headed us off N.E.
were ship to the W. at 9 took a squall from W.
were ship and steered N. under double reefed.
Barometer 29.42¹⁰⁰

Lat 33-07 Long 77-52

Remarks Monday Jan 7th

Began with strong winds from W. Course
N. under double reefed jib and main sail.
at 3 P.M. took jib and main sail, and
close reefed the fore top sail. Bar 29.4¹⁰⁰
Latter part fine wind S.W. the best weather
we have had since we got on Chili.
There is quite a heavy swell from S.W.

Bark Mary & Susan, off Mocha.
Remarks Tuesday January 8th 1878

Began with moderate breezes from S.W.
Course N. at sundown luffed too. Head to the
W.N.W. under two double reefed top sails.
Latter part fine breezes from S. at 5 P.M. put away N.E.
all sail set. Barometer 30.4¹⁰⁰ Lat 39-35 Long 75-32

Remarks Wednesday Jan 9th.

Began with fresh breezes from S. Course N.E.
at 7 P.M. luffed too head to the W.S.W. under two double reefed
top sails and stay sails. Mocha bearing by compass N.E. by N.
Dist 65 miles. Bar 30.1¹⁰⁰. Latter part a fresh gale from the
S. under double reefed main top sail & close bore. Saw
three sails. Bar 30 Lat 39-47 Long 75-54

Remarks Thursday Jan 10th.

Began with a gale from the S. ran from 1 P.M. to
1.30 P.M. N.W. then have too head to the W.S.W.
under close reefed main top sail and stay sails.
Bar 30.2 Latter part a gale from S.E. Bar 29.7¹⁰⁰
Lat 38-07 Long 76-33.

Remarks Friday Jan 11th.

Began with a gale from the S.E. have too head to the
S.W. under a close reefed main top sail and stay sails.
Bar 29.8¹⁰⁰. Latter part more moderate under
close reefed top sails. Lat 37-53 Long 76-48

Remarks Saturday Jan 12th.

Began with strong winds from S.E.
Heading to the S under close reefed jib & span-
ker. Bar 29.7¹⁰⁰. Latter part fine all sail
set. Saw black fish and porpoises.

Lat 38-01 Long 75-44

Remarks Sunday Jan 13th.

Began with moderate breezes from the S.
all sail set. at 7 P.M. shortened sail. Bar 30.2
Latter part pleasant breezes from S.

Lat 38-16 Long 75-19
