Remarks Monday March 24th 1878.
Begin with moderate breezes from the S.W. Spoke the Bk. Alm. Parker, Whaler.
Latter part strong winds from S.E. steering in for the Land. Saw Bark John Carver.

Lat 36-31 Long 74-35
Remarks Tuesday March 25th.
Begin with strong winds from S. Course E by S. for St. Mary's under double reef. At 5 P.M. made the Land Dist 25 miles. At 6 P.M. shortened sail and wore ship. Head to the W.S.W. at 1 A.M. wore ship to the Eastward at 5 A.M. made the Pt. of Rio Rio. At 10 3/4 A.M. passed Desiriguena. At 12 3/4 Anchored in Calcahuano. in 5 fathoms water. found the Chro about right.

Remarks Saturday April 20th 1878
Begin with light fair from the S. Latter part fresh breezes. At 11 1/4 A.M. took our anchor and sailed from Valea. At 12 1/4 passed Cambez Point. So Ends

Remarks Sunday April 21st
Begin with strong winds from the South and rough sea. Course W. The Cape Horn Began and Matilda sailed the same time. at sun down they were both out of sight astern. Middle and Latter parts strong winds.

Lat 35-34 Long 77-12
Remarks Monday April 22nd
Begin with fresh breezes from S.E. Course W.N.W. under double reef. Latter part moderate from S.W. Employed fitting a new boat for the Bk. Cranes.

Lat 34-30 Long 78-49
Remarks Tuesday April 23rd
Begin with moderate breezes from S.W. put a new boat on the Bk. Cranes. Juan in sight. Latter part moderate. Saw a double top sail whaling Bark. Lat 33-46 Long

Bark Mary & Susan, Cruising off Juan Hernandez.

Remarks Wednesday April 24th 1878.
Begin with pleasant breezes from W. at 10 P.M. Juan bearing W.S.W. Dist 30 miles. Latter part moderate breezes and baffling.

Lat 33-57
Remarks Thursday April 25th
Begin with light and baffling air. Juan bearing at 5 P.M. W.S.W. Dist 30 miles. Latter part strong winds from W.N.W. and squally. Lat 34-04

Remarks Friday April 26th.
Begin with strong winds from N.W. and squally. Head to the N.E. under double reef. At 5 Close reefed and furled the fore sail. Middle part strong winds and raining. Latter more moderate and thick.

Lat 33-30 Long 78-57
Remarks Saturday April 27th
Begin with strong winds from the W. and squally weather. Saw Bk. Barks, and one sail. Latter part strong winds from S. and rugged.

Lat 34-20 Long 79-13
Remarks Sunday April 28th
Begin with fresh breezes from S by E Course W. at 1 1/2 P.M. saw Juan. weather thick and squally. at 6 P.M. Island bearing N by E Dist 30 miles. Latter part moderate breezes. Course W by S. at 6 A.M. made Massafuera bearing W.N.W. Dist 50 miles.

Remarks Monday April 29th
Begin with moderate breezes from S by E Course W by S. at 6 P.M. Massafuera bearing W.S.W. Dist 8 miles. Latter part moderate breezes from the N. at noon Massafuera bearing S.E. by S Dist 25 miles. Lat 33-26 Long 80-45

Remarks Tuesday April 30th
Begin with fresh breezes from N.W. at 5 P.M. Massafuera bearing E by S Dist 12 miles. Middle part rainy. at 11 wind hauled to the S. Latter part fine. hauled the windlar out and cleaned and fitted the iron work. Lat 33-29
