Remarks Thursday May 16th N^o 18
 Begins with light breeze from S by E. saw
 Cpt. Spide and Black Blk. Latter part light
 breeze from S by E. at 6³/₄ A. M. raised a whale
 turning Buks at 7¹/₂ saw them spout. at 8 made
 them spout. Whales going quite quick to the W. N.
 W. at 8³/₄ lowered the boats and sailed and
 pulled for them. The Nautilus of our lee
 beam about three miles. The Matilda Star
 and Stambaul off our weather bow.
 thirteen boats after them. We should have
 struck but for the fate of the Nautilus.
 Mr. Nye was within a ship length of one
 when they fired off a gun. and the
 whale settled. Massafuero bearing E by
 N. Dist 60 miles Lat 33-27

Remarks Friday May 17th
 Begins with light air from S by E to
 W by W. Boats Chasing. At sundown
 gave up the chase. at 7¹/₂ got to the ship.
 Latter part light breeze and baffling.
 Lat 33-01 Long 82-19

Remarks Saturday May 18th
 Begins with light breeze from W by N.
 saw Hump Backs. Spoke the Nautilus and
 Matilda Star. Latter part strong winds from
 N by W. saw four whales.
 Lat 33-23

Remarks Sunday May 19th
 Begins with strong winds from N by W.
 at 3¹/₂ P. M. had a squall. then the
 wind hauled slowly to the southerly.
 Latter part moderate breeze. Massafuero
 in sight bearing E by S Dist 70 miles
 Lat 33-27

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Remarks Monday May 20th N^o 18
 Begins with light air from E to N by W. saw
 Hump Backs, Grampuses, Cow fish and Harpauis.
 and three sails. Spoke Matilda Lat 33-18 Long 82-02

Remarks Tuesday May 21st
 Begins with light air from N by W. three sails
 in sight. Massafuero bearing E by S Dist 70 miles.
 Latter part strong winds from the N. at 11 A. M. Double
 reefed. saw four sails. Lat 33-03 Long 82-27

Remarks Wednesday May 22nd
 Begins with strong winds from N. passed the
 English Bark Robert of Clyde. Latter part a strong
 Norther with heavy squalls. Lat at 10 have too head to
 the N. E. under close reefed main top sail and stay
 sails

Remarks Thursday May 23rd
 Begins with a Gale from the N. have too head
 to the N. E. under close reefed main top sail and
 stay sails. at 4 P. M. wore ship to the starboard
 as the vessel was drifting direct for Massafuero.
 at 6 P. M. blowing heavy with a bad sea rising.
 Barometer 29³/₁₀ at 6. Blowed away the fore top mast
 stay sail. the rig in the Reelant broke. let the fore
 stay sail. at 6 the wind hauled to the S in a squall.
 an awful searunning. at 7 wore ship head to the W.
 Latter part more moderate. but a bad sea.
 Lat 32-46 Long 81-47

Remarks Friday May 24th
 Begins with moderate winds from W by W
 and rough sea. Latter part fresh breeze from the
 N. employed repairing the fore top mast stay
 sail. Spoke the bounding Billow. saw
 two other whales. Massafuero in sight
 bearing E by S Dist 80 miles.
